#### FATHER'S DAY... Dads are a Big Deal...

#### 1 Corinthians 11:3 – NKJV

<sup>3</sup> But I want you to know that the head of every man is Christ, the head of woman *is* man, and the head of Christ *is* God.

#### Fathers sometimes get a bad rap.

Churches sometimes spend <u>Mother's Day bragging</u> on Mom and <u>Father's Day beating</u> up on Dad.

#### One small boy said,

"Father's Day is just like Mother's Day, <u>only you don't spend as much on</u> <u>the gift.</u>" May I speak for fathers everywhere when I say, "What gift?"

#### Mark Twain said,

"When I was a boy of 14 <u>my father was so ignorant</u> I could hardly stand to have the old man around. But when I got to 21, I was <u>astonished at</u> <u>how much the old man learned</u> in 7 years."

#### There are sayings we associate with our dads.

Here are the top ten Dad quotes from the article - - -

#### "The World According To Fathers" ...

- 1. What part of "no" don't you understand?
- 2. This is going to **hurt me** more than it hurts you.
- 3. Why? Because I said so!
- 4. I wasn't asleep; I was just **resting my eyes**.
- 5. Shut the door; were you born in a barn?
- 6. A little dirt never hurt anyone.
- 7. As long as you *live under my roof*, you'll live by my rules.
- 8. I'm not made out of money.
- 9. Don't make me stop this car!
- 10. Ask your **mother**.

Jewish tradition insists that fatherhood <u>is not necessarily</u> biological.

• The one who raises a child is considered the true parent.

## Teachers are like fathers,

• Where the father is only <u>a biological</u> relationship

It is the teacher who provides what a father should provide: guidance, values, discipline, direction and love.

In the first century, families were presided over by fathers who could do whatever they pleased in their homes.

- Rome had a law called "the father's power."
- Men who were Roman citizens were given absolute rights over their families.

# By law- - -

- The children and the wife
- Were regarded as the patriarch's personal property
- And he could do with them what he wished.

# A displeased father could

- Disown his children - -
- Sell them into slavery - -
- Or even <u>kill</u> them if he wished.

# When a child was born, the baby was placed between the father's feet.

- If the father **picked up the baby**, the child <u>stayed in the home</u>.
- If he turned and walked away - -
- The child was either left to die or sold at auction.

# **Seneca, a contemporary of the apostle Paul**, described Roman policy with regard to <u>unwanted animals</u>:

"We slaughter a fierce ox; we strangle a mad dog; we plunge a knife into a sick cow. <u>Children</u> born weak or deformed we drown."

# Things are *not much better today*, are they?

Millions of unwanted babies are **<u>aborted</u>** each year.

**Children** <u>have become a disposable commodity</u> in our society, just as they were in Rome!

# But the Bible calls <u>Christian fathers</u> to a different standard!

- Our kids are not property to own
- But *image bearers of God* who need to be trained.

## Dads, we are called to - - -

• Provide a proper <u>nurturing environment</u> - Where our <u>kids can grow up</u> *To love and serve the Lord!!!!!!* 

The <u>New Testament</u> challenges us to see the word "father" <u>as a verb</u> not just a noun.

• A verb is a word that <u>expresses an action</u> or a state of being.

# Fathers need to action!!!!

• A noun is a word used to <u>name a person</u>, animal, place, thing, and abstract idea.

Fathers are more than a name!!!!!!

It's biologically easy to become a father - - -

• But biblically challenging to actually "father" our children.

# The Bible very clearly challenges dads - - -

- To be the spiritual leader in their homes - -
- The <u>ultimate responsibility</u> for <u>what a family becomes</u> - -
- Belongs to the father!!!!!!!!

# *The primary part of that responsibility - - -* Is striking a balance between <u>LOVE and DISCIPLINE</u>.

## <u>Hebrews 12:7</u> – NIV

Endure hardship as discipline; God is treating you as his children. For <u>what</u> children are not disciplined by their father?

Who loves his child more, the <u>one who corrects</u> or the <u>one that allows</u> wrong?

God <u>corrects and disciplines</u> because of <u>His deep love for us.</u>

## <u>1 Thessalonians 2:11</u> - NIV

<sup>11</sup> For you **know that we dealt with** each of you as a father deals with his own children,

- No loving Father would neglect the safety of his children,
- Allowing <u>circumstances</u> That may be <u>harmful or fatal</u>!!!!!!

## <mark>Ephesians 6:4</mark> - NIV

<sup>4</sup> *Fathers*, (or parents) <u>do not exasperate</u> your children; instead, bring them up in the *training and instruction of the Lord.* 

• We do not want to <u>discourage</u> our children - - - But, raise them in a <u>Christ honoring</u> manner!

## <u>Colossians 3:21</u> - NIV

<sup>21</sup> Fathers, (Or parents) <u>do not embitter</u> your children, or they will become discouraged.

• Children need firm discipline administered in love.

## In writing to the Corinthians - - -

- Paul compares his role as an apostle to the role filled by a dad.
- <u>No one</u> can take the <u>unique place of dad</u>!

# <u>1 Corinthians 4:15</u> - NIV

<sup>15</sup> Even if you had ten thousand guardians in Christ, <u>you do not have</u> <u>many fathers</u>, for in Christ Jesus I became your father through the gospel.

## Paul was saying here that he was the founder of the church

- Paul's tough words were motivated by love -
- <u>Like the love</u> **a good father** has for his children.

One of the biggest threats to the generation we are now raising - - -Is the breakdown of the family.

Lifelong marriages provide the foundation for social order; everything of value rest on those underpinnings.

Historically, when the family begins to unravel in any culture, everything else is adversely affected.

70% of black babies and 20% of white babies born in North America are **born out of wedlock**.

• Most of them will never know their fathers – or a father's love.

Only 1/3 of children born in North America will live with both biological parents through age 18.

## How does this affect us?

85% of children <u>with behavior disorders</u> are from fatherless homes
71% of <u>high school drop outs</u> are from fatherless homes
70% of <u>teen pregnancies</u> are from fatherless homes
80% of <u>rapists</u> are from fatherless homes
75% of <u>teen patients in drug abuse</u> centers are from fatherless homes
70% of <u>juveniles in correctional institutions</u> are from fatherless homes
85% of <u>youths in prison</u> are from fatherless homes
63% of <u>youth suicides</u> are from fatherless homes

Thirty years ago, <u>we believed that poverty and racial discrimination</u> were primarily responsible <u>for juvenile crime and behavioral problems</u>.

Now, nearly all of the evidence points to <u>family breakup as the real</u> <u>culprit</u>, and <u>predicts a societal catastrophe</u> if we <u>don't</u> turn this trend around!

**72% of North Americans** say <u>the physical absence</u> of fathers is the <u>most</u> <u>serious problem facing our families.</u>

## How can you buck the trend?

#### By <u>committing</u> your life totally to Christ and <u>raising your family to do the</u> <u>same</u>!

Christian fathers - do not lie, steal, lust and covet!

- do not serve the god of money!
- do not father and then abandon their children!
- do not cheat on their wives!
- don't send their kids to church, they take them!
- have a REAL relationship with God!!!!!!!!!

#### The <u>greatest need</u> of the hour is <u>united homes</u> where <u>Christ is</u> <u>exalted</u>!

Many of you were raised in homes where this was NOT the case - - -

 The Bible has special value for you since it shows us an IDEAL father – <u>God Himself</u>!

#### <u>Matthew 7:9-11</u> - NIV

<sup>9</sup> "Which of you, if your son asks for bread, will give him a stone? <sup>10</sup> Or if he asks for a fish, will give him a snake?

<sup>11</sup> If you, then, **though you are evil**, <u>know how to give good gifts to your</u> <u>children</u>, **how much more** will your Father in heaven give good gifts to those who ask him!

As we learn to know God better as a loving father, **we <u>learn to ask for</u>** <u>what is good for us</u>, he then grants it!

Many miss the fact that we must 1<sup>st</sup> be born again to receive God's blessings.

## <mark>John 15:7</mark> - NIV

<sup>7</sup> If you remain <u>in me</u> and my words remain <u>in you</u>, **ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you**.

- Apart from Christ our efforts are unfruitful.
- Are you receiving the nourishment and life offered by Christ?

# Galatians 4:6- 7- NIV

<sup>6</sup> **Because you are his sons**, God sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts, the Spirit who calls out, *"Abba*, Father."

<sup>7</sup> So you are no longer a slave, **but God's child;** and since you are his child, **God has made you** <u>also an heir</u>.

# <u>As God's heirs</u> – we <u>learn to ask for what is good for us</u>, he then grants it!

- We can claim what he has provided for us -
- Our full identity as <u>His children</u>!

## The Story of Jairus – Mark 5:22-24 - Mark 5:35-42

- 1. He was the father of a young daughter.
- 2. His daughter was in urgent need, due to a severe illness.
- 3. He pleaded earnestly for her to Jesus.
- 4. He exhibited great faith on her behalf, Mark 5:40
- 5. Jesus answered by miraculously raising the girl from the dead.

Jairus's crisis made him feel confused, afraid, and without hope.

- Jesus' words to Jairus in the midst of crisis speaks to us as well,
- "<u>Don't be afraid</u>, <u>Just Believe</u>."

The Story of the Father of a Deaf-Mute, Epileptic Son, Mark 9:17-27

- 1. His son was in great need.
- 2. The father had faith to come to Jesus and His disciples.
- 3. That <u>faith was initially disappointed</u> because the disciples could not do anything.

- 4. Even so, the father **asked for** <u>an increase of faith</u>, Mark 9:23-24.
- 5. Jesus answered by miraculously healing the son.

Jesus meant here that anything is possible <u>if we believe</u> - - - Because nothing is too difficult for God.

Closing:

<u>Growing in faith</u> is a constant process <u>of daily renewing</u> our trust in Jesus.

Fathers it is time to Appeal!!!!!!!!

- 1. Fathers: It is time to believe God for your family and intercede for your family.
- 2. Everyone: it is time

If you have faith, God will work in your life.

If you think <u>you are lacking in faith</u>, call out to the Lord anyway and <u>ask Him to increase your faith</u>.

We must continue to <u>trust God</u> because, in time, <u>He will fulfill all His</u> <u>promises</u>!
