Take Off That Mask

Matthew 7:15 – NKJV - You Will Know Them by Their Fruits ¹⁵ "Beware of false prophets, who come to you in sheep's clothing, but *inwardly* they are ravenous wolves.

<u>Inwardly</u>

- Who they <u>really</u> are...
- They say they are one thing but,
- They turn out to be something else.

There is a <u>danger</u> in aligning yourself with someone <u>who is not</u> who they say they are.

Jesus said watch out for these people because who they really are is something <u>far different then who they appear to be</u>.

- I understand that <u>*a sheep*</u> is a harmless animal.
- They <u>do not prey</u> on other animals.
- They eat grass and not meat.
- A wolf on the other hand is something that <u>kills and eats whatever</u> <u>it can</u>, whenever it can.
- The wolf is obviously something that is very dangerous.

You can be injured very quickly when you hang around people who appear to be one thing but turn out to be something far different.

Jesus told us that there are some people, who appear to be very religious,

- They look like they are one of the sheep.
- They dress the part
- They look the part
- They may even sound like a sheep.

But given time and opportunity - - -

WHO they really are will be revealed and you may not like what you see.

Warning Against the Teachers of the Law

Mark 12:38-40 – **NIV** - ³⁸ As he taught, **Jesus said,** "Watch out for the teachers of the law. They like to walk around in flowing robes and be greeted with respect in the marketplaces,

³⁹ and have the most important seats in the synagogues and the places of honor at banquets.

⁴⁰ They devour widows' houses and for a show make lengthy prayers. These men will be punished most severely."

When you read the Gospels, you will find a common thread with Jesus.

He **does not like** people who <u>say they are one thing</u> but <u>are actually</u> something else.

Jesus didn't like people who wore masks.

- Here's why - -
- People who wear masks *create confusion* in the Church.
- They *misrepresent to the world* who Jesus is and *what living for Him is really all about*.

This confusion causes those people who need salvation

- To be turned away from the Church
- Because they find there *something worse* than their own situation.
- <u>Hypocrisy</u>!!!!!!!!!

Jesus told a parable one day... He said....

Luke 6:41-42 - NIV

⁴¹ "Why do you look at the <u>speck of sawdust</u> in your brother's eye and <u>pay</u> <u>no attention</u> to the **plank in your own eye?**

⁴² How can you say to your brother, 'Brother, <u>let me take the speck out of your eye</u>,' when <u>you yourself fail to see</u> the plank in your own eye? <u>You hypocrite</u>, first take the plank out of your eye, and then you will see clearly to remove the speck from your brother's eye.

Can you imagine a person walking around with a beam in their eye - trying to help other people get the little splinters out that they may have.

I hear Jesus saying to us today.

- Take off the mask.
- Stop pretending to be something that you are not.
- It is better to <u>be real</u>.
- It is better to <u>be honest</u>.

This is why you hear **Jesus** over and over telling people to <u>**not judge</u>** one another.</u>

- He knew that if people in the church were to **judge one another**
- The person being judged may start acting like nothing was wrong
- To keep other people *from judging them*.

Listen if we act like nothing is wrong, we'll never get healed.

- If we pretend like everything is honky dory in our lives - -
- When really we need the church to pray for us and support us
- We will never be **benefitted by** the love of the family of God.

Can I say today, "There is a beauty in being who you really are."?

- When you are **genuine**, <u>God can use you</u>!!!!!!!!!!
- If who you really are would prevent Him from using you - -
- He now can <u>work on you</u> and <u>heal you</u> to the point that <u>He can then</u> <u>use you</u>.

Hear me...your life doesn't have to be perfect for God to use you.

- It just has to *be honest*.
- It just has to <u>be real</u>.

When I read <u>the scriptures</u>, I find <u>**God using**</u> some pretty savory individuals.

Some of them <u>are liars</u> - Some of them <u>thieves</u> - Some were <u>drunks</u>
 Some <u>adulterers</u> - Some <u>murderers</u>.

One man who God used to write most of the New Testament had actually been a <u>murderer and torturer</u> of *Christian men, women and children.*

- I'm not sure it gets any worse than that.
- But in the day that *Paul had a coming to God moment* where <u>he</u> <u>took off his mask</u> of religious piety, God said, "<u>Now I can use him</u>."

You see, at some point it's time to *take off the suit and tie* and **show them** who Jesus really is.

- Or maybe for you *it's not* a suit and tie.
- Maybe it's your pride.
- Or maybe it's **your <u>pain</u>**.
- Or your prosperity.
- Or your <u>education</u>.

At some point it's time to *take off the mask* that <u>the real you hides behind</u> *so the Holy Spirit can heal you* so you can show <u>your family</u> and <u>your</u> <u>neighbors</u> *who Jesus Christ* <u>really is</u>!

- I don't know about you, but *<u>I want to be real</u>*.
- I want to be honest with God and with you.

<u>1 Timothy 3:16</u> - NKJV

¹⁶ And without controversy great is the mystery of godliness: God was manifested in the flesh, Justified in the Spirit,
Seen by angels,
Preached among the Gentiles,
Believed on in the world,
Received up in glory.

I don't know if everybody knows this or not, but 1 Timothy 3:16 tells us - - -

- The Great God of the Universe - -
- Stepped down off of the throne of Heaven - -
- Took of *His royal robes*
- And clothed Himself in the weakness of human flesh

We want <u>this church</u> to be <u>approachable</u>.

We want to be *accessible* to anyone who would walk through our doors.

<u>Masks</u> you see come in many forms.

Jesus mentioned the scribes and their long clothing...

- They loved to dress up and put on the image of religion.
- They thought what they wore made them Holy.
- They thought how they looked told people who they were.

Inwardly Jesus said, "they *devour* widows houses", but *outwardly they pretended to represent* the Kingdom of God.

That's what I love about Jesus:

- I don't have to put on some mask in order to be loved by Him.
- He loves me just the way I am.
- He died for me when <u>I was at my worst</u>.
- He cared for me when <u>what I looked like</u> and <u>what I acted like</u> was completely reprehensible to Him.

That's why I love Him - - -

- You don't have to put on some act to be accepted by Him.
- You don't have to *wear a mask* for *Him to love you or use you*.
- You just *have to be real*.
- You just *have to be honest*.

You see *if we are <u>not real,</u> we never will reach people* with the love of Jesus.

• You can't wear pride and show people Jesus

And I'll tell you something else,

- you can't wear a mask that Looks Like Jesus - -
- And pretends to represent Him
- If you really <u>don't</u> and I'll tell you why...

People's needs are too great.

Take Off That Mask

- <u>A false image of God</u> cannot heal the broken hearted.
- A fake persona that tries to be religious - -
- Cannot minister to people whose lives are falling apart.

If we're going to be <u>used to reach this world</u> the way Jesus intended for us to reach it

- We are going to have to *take off the masks*
- <u>Be vulnerable</u> to the criticisms of those <u>who would judge us</u>.

I'm putting down the piety and picking up the cross that Jesus died on - - -

- So I can <u>show the people</u> I love how much <u>He loves them</u>.
- It's time <u>to be real</u>.
- It's time <u>to be honest</u>.

I've stopped acting the way I think people expect me to act - - -

• I've started loving people the way I know <u>He wants me to love them</u>.

Can I say today, "It's important to be real."?

- It's ok to *be common*
- It's ok to *authentic.*
- It's ok to Take Off That Mask.
- It's ok to be someone who people can relate to.
- If they cannot relate to us how will they hear us when we tell them about our God.

CLOSE:

I know today that **you have loved ones** <u>you would really like to introduce</u> to Jesus.

I know today that *there are people in your family* that <u>you would like to</u> <u>see come to church</u>.

The people around us <u>need to feel what we experience</u> when we come together on a Sunday morning like this.

I wonder today *if you would consider* spending some time this week -

- With someone you know and love - -
- <u>Inviting them</u> to **be your guest** here next week.
- Let's take off whatever MASK it is - -
- That is **separating us** from *the ones that we love*.
- Let's show them that we love them.
- Let's show them that we care about them.
- Let's show them Jesus.

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
