Would You Like To Get Well?

John 5:1-9 – NKJV - A Man Healed at the Pool of Bethesda

5 After this there was a feast of the Jews, and Jesus went up to Jerusalem.

²Now there is in Jerusalem by the Sheep *Gate* a pool, which is called in Hebrew, Bethesda, having five porches.

³ In these lay a great multitude of sick people, blind, lame, paralyzed, waiting for the moving of the water.

⁴ For an angel went down at a certain time into the pool and stirred up the water; then whoever stepped in first, after the stirring of the water, was made well of whatever disease he had.

⁵ Now <u>a certain man</u> was there who <u>had an infirmity thirty-eight years</u>. ⁶ When Jesus saw him lying there, and knew that he already had been *in that condition* a long time, He said to him, <u>"Do you want to be made</u> <u>well?"</u>

⁷ The sick man answered Him, "Sir, I have no man to put me into the pool when the water is stirred up; but while I am coming, another steps down before me."

⁸ Jesus said to him, "Rise, take up your bed and walk."

⁹ And immediately the man was made well, took up his bed, and walked. And that day was the Sabbath.

Bethesda:

- St. Anne's Church in Jerusalem -
- Deep excavation marking pool

Hebrew name means "house of mercy"

- A reservoir
- A swimming bath
- With five porches
- Close to the sheep-gate or market

At this time, Bethesda has obviously become **<u>somewhat of a healing</u> <u>shrine</u>**.

Many people <u>in our world today</u> flock to very similar places. Some seem to receive help; sadly, <u>most do not</u>.

Those lying around the pool symbolize humanity:

- Absolutely <u>helpless</u> with <u>crippling addictions</u>
- Blinding ambitions
- And <u>paralyzing</u> conditions.

Although we try so hard to be self-sufficient, we are impotent – completely powerless –

- To change our inner lives under our own power.
- That's why we devour self-help books
- That's why these people flocked to a promised cure.

The problem with Bethesda was that it seemed to work for some, but not for most.

- The **FIRST** person into the water was cured.
- That's the way it seems to work in life
- There's always someone first and someone last
- That's why we so jealously **guard our** <u>number one</u> status in the human family.

Into this <u>atmosphere of frustration</u> walks Jesus (the son of God!)

• He heads directly to one of the most senior members of the Bethesda fraternity.

His question cuts to the chase:

"WOULD YOU LIKE TO GET WELL?"

The <u>answer seems so obvious</u>, and yet consider this:

- The man had not asked Jesus for help
- A beggar of that day <u>could lose a sometimes profitable</u> and <u>easy</u> income if he were cured.
- He would have to <u>lose his</u> "<u>victim mentality</u>" and that's not always easy to do!

Look at his answer – it's an <u>EXCUSE</u>!

- "I don't have anyone to put me in the pool!"
- For 38 years, I've *been a victim* of the <u>carelessness</u>
- Indifference and inefficiency
- Of my family, My friends, and even the church.

EXCUSE - They have all these <u>special meetings</u> where the waters are troubled, but *it always seems like <u>someone else</u> gets the help!*

• I'm just left sitting here while *it happens all around me*.

JESUS KNOWS THAT <u>THE MAN'S "FOCUS" IS PRECISELY THE</u> <u>PROBLEM</u>!

• So He bypasses the man's excuse and offers him a solution.

Imagine this man <u>staring intently toward</u> the waters of <u>Bethesda</u> while the <u>Son of God stands beside him</u> **offering healing!**

• "Get out of my way, Jesus - don't block my view of the pool!"

DO YOU <u>WANT TO</u> BE WELL?

There is no attempt by Jesus to judge the man's worthiness or even his faith level.

- Jesus just needs to know one thing -
- ARE YOU <u>WILLING</u>?

But my condition is not my fault!

• That's not the issue - ARE YOU WILLING?

But you don't know how long <u>l've felt this way</u>!

• That's not the issue - ARE YOU WILLING?

But you don't know what I'm hiding!

• That's not the issue - ARE YOU WILLING?

Jesus wants to give us <u>wholeness</u> – To *make us what we were <u>always</u> <u>meant to be</u>,*

- But we are such <u>defensive</u>,
- Guilt-ridden, Complicated people
- THAT We cannot respond easily to His simple offer.

Jesus is still asking, "WOULD YOU LIKE TO GET WELL?"

It's like <u>the choice Moses gave to the people</u> he had led for 40 years when he was on the verge of death ...

<u>Deuteronomy 30:19</u> – NKJV

¹⁹ I call heaven and earth as witnesses today against you, **that I have set before you** <u>life and death</u>, <u>blessing and cursing</u>; therefore <u>choose life</u>, that both you and your descendants may live;

Moses knew like we do that <u>many, if not most,</u> of <u>our circumstances</u> <u>in life are chosen</u>.

We make <u>unhealthy</u>, <u>unrewarding</u> choices and <u>then blame others for</u> <u>our situation</u>!

- We can either **consider ourselves the victims** of the <u>insensitivity of</u> <u>others</u>...
- Or we can just square our shoulders and make better choices!

CHOICE <u>IS THE ISSUE</u>.

<u>CHOOSE LIFE BY CHOOSING GOD!</u>

The <u>unspoken message</u> in *Jesus' question* is that we sometimes <u>must</u> pay a price to be well.

There are benefits to having an illness, an excuse.

- The man by the pool didn't have to work
- Someone <u>carried him</u> around every day
- He may have had other perks
- But all of them paled in comparison to just becoming well!

I consider only one kind of counselee relatively hopeless:

- The person who *blames* other people for his or her problems.
- If you can take ownership of the mess you're in - -
- There is <u>hope available</u> for you!!!!

Dr. Martin Seligman the author of a book called - Learned Optimism.

In it, this respected psychologist says that

- We all have in our hearts a YES or a NO.
- We respond to life either <u>negatively</u> or positively.

Seligman's thesis is that we can **learn to put a YES** in our hearts <u>and by</u> <u>doing so</u> *can* <u>*change the course of our lives*</u>.

CLOSE: This is the heart <u>of what Jesus is asking</u>:

- Do you want to <u>be well</u>?
- Do you want your marriage to work?
- Do you want to get over that bitterness?
- Do you want to walk away from the sin that binds you?
- Do you want to be saved?

2 Corinthians 1:19-20 – NIV

¹⁹ For the Son of God, Jesus Christ, who was preached among you by us by me and Silas and Timothy—**was not "Yes" and "No**," but in him it has always been "**Yes.**"

²⁰ For no matter how many promises God has made, they are "Yes" in **Christ.** And so through him the "Amen" is spoken by us to the glory of God.

JESUS IS GOD'S "<u>YES</u>" FOR YOUR LIFE!

And, just like the man at the pool - - -

- When Jesus gives a command - -
- There is power in the command -
- To *fulfill the command*!!!!!

Say YES to Jesus this afternoon....

- Whatever your <u>struggling with</u> his morning
- Pick up your mat and walk!!!!!!!!
- Whatever <u>your need is</u> this afternoon...
- Do you want to get well???
- Pick up your mat and walk....

IT'S NO LONGER <u>ABOUT YOUR POWER, BUT ABOUT HIS POWER</u>!

In the same way that He spoke the world into being ---

Genesis 1:3 - "Let there be light, and there was light"

Jesus' spoken words had the power to cure

John 1:3 – "<u>All things</u> were made by him; and <u>without him</u> was <u>not</u> <u>anything</u> made that was made"

WOULD YOU LIKE TO GET WELL?

Would you like to be saved?

Remember this man - had an infirmity thirty-eight years!!!!!

- No More excuses...
- No More Victim Mentality....
- CHOICE IS THE ISSUE.
- CHOOSE LIFE BY CHOOSING GOD!

Let Christ Jesus be your <u>YES</u> - - -

Get up, Pick up your Mat and walk away from your infirmity....
