All throughout the Bible God has ordained that there would be <u>memorials.</u>

In a Biblical sense <u>a memorial is a sacrifice</u>, a <u>monument</u> or <u>an event</u> that brings us into remembrance of something that God has done.

The word *memorial in scripture* comes from a word that means to prick, to pierce, or to penetrate the memory.

So *memorials are to* aid man's memory in preserving what he cherishes the most.

¹³ **Greater love has <u>no one</u>** than this, than to lay down one's life for his friends.

God so loved the world that He "gave."

- This is the secret of love
- To give, to share, that others may benefit.

Jesus Christ, the begotten Son, <u>was given to the world</u> to share His mercy and grace to all.

God delivered His love through the Son.

- It wasn't enough for God to speak from Heaven and say, "I love you, world."
- Love shows action.

The delivering love of God was seen by His Son dying on the cross for our sins.

When Jesus Christ walked this earth, He showed His love.

1. <u>Sharing love</u>.

Jesus <u>opened the eyes</u> of the blind, <u>healed lepers</u>, <u>caused the dumb</u> to talk, and <u>raised</u> the dead. He <u>gave power to His disciples</u> over all the forces of the devil.

<mark>John 13:34-35</mark> - NKJV

³⁴ A new commandment I give to you, that you <u>love one another</u>; as I have loved you, that you also love one another. ³⁵ <u>By this all will know that you</u> <u>are My disciples</u>, <u>if</u> you have love for one another."

As Christ loved us, we are to love one another.

- We are not disciples of Christ by building a huge Temple.
- By giving large sums of money.
- By looking holy.
- We are disciples of Christ if we love one another.

As Jesus shared His love, we are to share our love to our neighbors.

• Love your neighbor, be gentle, kind, and considerate.

When Jesus walked this earth, He showed:

2. <u>Enduring love</u>.

Jesus endured <u>hunger</u>, that we might be fed. He endured the shame and beatings for our sake.

- He endured the crown of thorns.
- He endured the nails in His hands.
- He endured the stripes upon His back.

Hebrews 12:2 - NKJV

² looking unto Jesus, the author and finisher of *our* faith, who for the joy that was set before Him <u>endured</u> the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God.

We are to endure all things for Christ's sake.

2 Timothy 2:10 - NKJV

¹⁰ Therefore <u>I endure all things</u> for the sake of the elect, th<u>at they also may</u> <u>obtain the salvation</u> which is in Christ Jesus with eternal glory.

- Let us have the enduring love of Christ.
- Let us endure the trials and persecutions.
- Let us endure the shame and ridicule, living for Him.

Paul told Timothy to endure afflictions.

• Christ <u>endured</u> more than we will ever experience.

Jesus tells us in

Matthew 10:22 - NKJV

²² And you will be hated by all for My name's sake. But <u>he who endures</u> to the end will be saved.

- Endure all things
- Hold on to enduring love.

<u>When Jesus walked this earth, He showed:</u>

Faithful love.

Christ was faithful unto death, even the death of the cross.

- He was faithful in His service.
- He was faithful in His cause for salvation to all.

We today, are to demonstrate faithful love.

- We should be faithful to the House of God.
- in giving of our substance.
- in our praise and worship.
- to <u>our word</u>.
- to our spouse.

If we remain faithful -

Revelation 2:10 - NKJV

¹⁰ Do not fear any of those things which you are about to suffer. Indeed, the devil is about to throw *some* of you into prison, that you may be tested, and you will have tribulation ten days. <u>Be faithful until death, and I will give</u> you the crown of life.

God wants us to demonstrate faithful love!!!!!!!!

When Jesus walked this earth, He showed:

4. Forgiving love.

When He was on the cross, Jesus said, "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do."

• Jesus, in His dying hour, **forgave** those who were against Him.

We need to <u>demonstrate this forgiving</u> love today.

²¹ Then Peter came to Him and said, "Lord, how often shall my brother sin against me, and I forgive him? Up to seven times?"

Peter was admonished by Jesus to forgive his brother seventy times seven.

Let us forgive others, as Christ forgave us of our sins.

- Our world would be a better place,
- if we demonstrated forgiving love.

When Jesus walked this earth, He showed:

5. <u>Saving love</u>.

While on the cross, **Jesus saved a thief**, who cried out for mercy.

In His earthly ministry, He forgave and saved others.

His willingness to die on the cross, was an act of *saving love* for the *whole world*.

Jesus came to <u>save</u>, <u>heal</u>, and <u>proclaim</u> the gospel, and the Kingdom of *Heaven*.

Let us go forth today, **with <u>the saving love</u> of God**, and <u>reach out with the</u> <u>gospel of Christ</u>.

Peter preached the gospel on the Day of Pentecost, *with saving love*.

He was *concerned for the lost souls* of his generation.

When Jesus walked this earth, He demonstrated:

6. <u>Conquering love</u>.

Jesus <u>conquered</u> death, Hell, and the grave. He <u>conquered</u> the forces of Satan for our behalf.

He stands today, as the world greatest *conqueror*.

- He conquered more than Alexander the Great.
- He conquered more than <u>Caesar</u>.
- He conquered more than <u>Napoleon</u>.
- Jesus conquered through love.

Let us go forth today, with the conquering love of Christ, and set the captives free.

- We can conquer temptation.
- We can conquer the forces of Satan.

Paul said, in **Romans 8:37** - NKJV

³⁷ Yet in all these things we are **more than conquerors** through Him who loved us.

7. Sustaining love.

<mark>Psalm 55:22</mark> - NKJV

- He will <u>uplift us</u>.
- He will support us.
- He will enlighten us.
