GOD AT YOUR SERVICE

Psalm 46:1-7 NKJV - God the Refuge of His People and Conqueror of the Nations

46 God is our refuge and strength, A very present help in trouble.

²Therefore we will not fear, Even though the earth be removed, And though the mountains be carried into the midst of the sea;

³ *Though* its waters roar *and* be troubled, *Though* the mountains shake with its swelling.

⁴*There is* a river whose streams shall make glad the city of God, The holy *place* of the tabernacle of the Most High.

⁵ God *is* in the midst of her, she shall not be moved; God shall help her, just at the break of dawn.

⁶The nations raged, the kingdoms were moved; He uttered His voice, the earth melted.

⁷ The LORD of hosts is with us; The God of Jacob is our refuge.

INTRO **GOD AT YOUR SERVICE

What an *incredible testimony of promise* we discover in the words of the psalmist.

- God is our *refuge and strength*!
- He is a very present help in time of trouble!
- Literally, that means that <u>God is a very accessible help</u> He is one easy to be found.
- In **II Chronicles 15**, Azariah told Asa:
 - God will stick with you as long as you stick with Him.
 - If you look for Him, He will let Himself be found...
 - Then he explained <u>that when Israel got in trouble</u> and turned to the Lord, "<u>He was found of them</u>" (verse 4).
- <u>Somebody needs to latch on</u> to the promise of the Lord that we find in this particular passage...
 - Never again do you need to fear or be afraid.

- It **doesn't matter** if the whole world is in turmoil.
- The **<u>earth</u>** may quake, the <u>**oceans**</u> may swell, and the <u>**mountains**</u> may crumble into the sea.
- Everything around you may be in <u>a total uproar</u> <u>complete chaos</u>...
 - But, with God as your protector and provider, you'll have peace like a river!

Listen to Pastor:

- God's Word promises us that <u>He is available to us</u> at any time, day or night!
- From *The Message*, our text reads:
- <u>Psalm 46:1-7</u>
 - God is a safe place to hide, ready to help when we need Him.
 - <u>We stand **fearless**</u> at the cliff-edge of doom, <u>courageous</u> in seastorm and earthquake,
 - Before the rush and roar of oceans, the tremors that shift mountains...<u>God fights for us</u> (and) protects us...
 - [Then in verse 5, it says,] <u>God lives here</u>, the streets are safe, <u>God at</u> <u>your service</u> from crack of dawn.

****COMPREHENDING GOD'S PRESENCE**

*I am <u>not</u> certain that <u>we comprehend this truth</u> fully.

- Most of us would very likely admit that <u>our concept of God's abiding</u> presence <u>is inadequate</u>.
- It is my belief, however, that **God wants to open** <u>our understanding</u> of this divine concept.
 - **He knows** we all face <u>deep needs</u> and <u>terrible troubles</u>.
 - We all encounter <u>turmoil</u>, <u>temptations</u>, and <u>times of confusion</u> that <u>cause our souls to quake</u>.

His message for us here in *Psalm 46* is meant for just such times.

*If we give in to fear – if we become <u>downcast and full of despair</u> – *we're living* <u>absolutely contrary</u> to His present reality in our lives.

- But if we learn to <u>trust Him</u> even when <u>we can't trace Him</u>, *He promises to* be <u>our refuge and our strength</u>!
- **<u>He promises</u>** to be <u>easy to find</u> and <u>ready to offer any help</u> we may need.
 - Therefore, **if we live in faith**, He will be **at our service** morning and night.

*Peter writes in 2 Peter 1:4 – CEV

God made great and marvelous **promises**, so that *his nature would become part of us*. Then we could escape **<u>our evil desires</u>** and the <u>**corrupt influences**</u> of this world.

- Supernatural peace is a part of God's divine nature.
 - Tell your neighbor: "<u>God lives here</u>, the streets are safe!"
- **Of all his wonderful promises**, <u>Psalm 46</u> is the one word we need to obtain <u>*His peace like a river.*</u>

Let me share with you **three things** that we can glean from this passage.

**1st EVER-PRESENT EVIL

*The first thing we learn is that just as there is an <u>ever-present help</u>, there is also an <u>ever-present evil</u>.

Paul attests, "When I would do good, evil is present with me" Romans 7:21.

In Ephesians 6:12, Paul declares, "<u>We wrestle not against flesh and blood</u>, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high places."

- Listen, there is a very real enemy of our souls, and this enemy is at work against us, day and night.
- Paul wants to make sure <u>we understand</u> this.

If we <u>don't</u> — if we're ignorant of <u>what our battle is</u> and who we're fighting — then we'll surely be <u>defeated</u>.

- From the <u>Gospels</u> to the <u>Epistles</u> to <u>Revelation</u>, the entire <u>New Testament</u> warns us <u>not to be ignorant</u> of <u>Satan's devices</u>.
 - This doesn't mean that we are to fear or magnify the devil's power
 - Satan is still "prince of the power of the air"
 - He rules an evil empire of *demonic powers*.

These principalities do his constant bidding, continually harassing God's people.

- It's extremely *dangerous* to be blind to *Satan's ways*.
 - We simply have to <u>accept</u> that our present battle <u>isn't</u> a human one.
- It doesn't matter what struggle we face, what sin we wrestle with.
 - We have to realize, **it's not** merely about <u>some flaw in our character</u>.
 - It's not some <u>habit</u> to be worked out in our flesh.
 - **Our conflict** is no less than a supernatural battle that's unfolding in spiritual high places.
 - And our foe is an *ever-present enemy*.

This is why Peter urges us in I Peter 5:8-9 CEV

⁸ Be on your guard and stay awake. Your enemy, the devil, is like a roaring lion, sneaking around to find someone to attack.

⁹ But you must <u>resist the devil</u> and <u>stay strong in your faith</u>. You know that all over the world <u>the Lord's followers</u> are suffering just as you are.

Peter experienced this firsthand.

Jesus had <u>warned him</u>, Luke 22:31 - Jesus said, "Simon, listen to me! *Satan has demanded the right to test each one of you*, as a farmer does when he separates wheat from the husks.

- Jesus' Disciples would Be <u>Tested</u>
- Christ knew the devil wanted this apostle.
- And *Jesus gave Peter <u>ample warning</u>* about what was to come.

You can be sure of this:

- if you no longer settle for a Christian life that is merely status-quo
- If you've stepped out to give your all to the Lord
- You can *expect* to be assaulted by an ever-present evil.

If this describes <u>you</u> -

Satan and his helpers will <u>come after you</u> with <u>accusations</u>, <u>hindrances</u>, <u>lies</u> that flood your thoughts</u>.

- You'll be <u>tempted</u>, <u>persecuted</u>, <u>interrupted</u> in your prayers.
- You must know that it's all a conspiracy of evil
- Aimed straight at <u>your faith</u>.

Satan <u>won't</u> bother harassing <u>his own children</u> because <u>he has no controversy</u> with them.

Jesus says of such people, <u>You are of your father the devil</u>, and the desires of your father you want to do. (John 8:44).

- Satan has one thing in mind, and that is to undermine your faith.
- He wants you to doubt God's faithfulness.
- **There are many today** many who have <u>lived for God</u> for most of their lives...
 - That have *begun to doubt the Lord* in the **midst of their trial**.
 - They simply **don't** <u>*understand*</u> what they are going through.
 - And what they are going through *is a spiritual assault!*

Make <u>no mistake</u>: the <u>enemy's attacks</u> are <u>especially fierce</u> in these last days.

- Such attacks simply **aren't** going to let up *until Christ returns*.
- Reality is, *we're in <u>a constant battle</u>*; and we must <u>recognize it as such</u>.

** 2nd EVER-PRESENT GOD

Second, just as there is an ever-present evil, there is an ever-present God!

<u>God has promised</u> us that, "In your time of trouble – *when you face* a persistent, unrelenting, and ever-present evil – *I will be your ever-present help!*"

We've already established that the phrase "ever present" <u>means</u>, "always here, always available, with unlimited access."

- In short, the abiding presence of the Lord is always in us!
 - And if He's ever-present in us -
 - then *He wants <u>continual</u> conversation* with us.
- He wants us to <u>talk</u> with him no matter where we are:
 - On the job,
 - With family,
 - With friends,
 - While we're hunting or fishing,
 - When we're on vacation,

Just remember, *he is always with us* and *He wants a relationship with us*.

I refuse to accept the lie Satan has thrust upon <u>so many of God's people</u> today:

- That the Lord has <u>stopped</u> speaking to his people.
- It **doesn't matter** what the devil brings against us.

God's power in his people will always be greater than Satan's assaults.

** 3rd EVER-PRESENT PROBLEM

Finally, along with the <u>ever-present evil</u> and an <u>ever-present God</u>, we have an <u>ever-present problem of unbelief</u>.

This is *the only thing that hinders* some from an *intimate walk in the Spirit*.

- Israel never did learn to trust God's ever-present help.
 - The Lord led them through the wilderness with *a cloud by day* and *a pillar of fire by night*.
 - These supernatural works were visible reminders to God's people of <u>his constant presence</u> with them.
 - He was <u>at their right hand</u> every hour of the day.
 - And <u>he led them</u> like a gentle, caring shepherd.

When they obeyed him, they were <u>safe and at peace</u>, <u>no matter what obstacles</u> <u>they faced.</u>

Yet, in spite of God's loving guidance, Psalm 78:22-23, 33 CEV

²² <u>They had refused to trust him</u>, and they had doubted his saving power.
²³ But God gave a command to the clouds, and he opened the doors in the skies.
³³ So he cut their lives short and made them terrified.

- Do you see what the <u>Psalmist</u> is saying here?
- He's connecting the supernatural cloud and fire with God's salvation.
- Trusting in those signs literally would have saved the Israelites' lives.
 - But because they didn't trust in God's work on their behalf
 - They ended up *lost*
 - <u>Wandering in confusion</u> the rest of their days.

CLOSE:

Now I want to <u>return to where we started</u>, with Psalm 46. I believe this Psalm is a picture of the New Testament "promised land."

Psalm 46 represents the divine rest referred to in Hebrews:

Hebrews 4:9 NKJV - There remains therefore a rest for the people of God.

- Psalm 46 describes this rest to God's people.
- It speaks of His ever-present strength,
- His help in time of trouble, and
- His peace in the midst of chaos.

God's presence is with us at all times and <u>his help always</u> arrives on time.

Yet Israel rejected this rest: Psalm 106:24 NKJV

²⁴ Then they <u>despised</u> the pleasant land; They <u>did not believe</u> His word

Sadly, the church today is much like Israel.

In spite of God's great promises to us

- His assurances of peace Help and full supply
- We <u>don't trust him</u> fully
- Is he with me or not?
- Where is any evidence of his presence?
- Why does he keep letting these hardships pile up on me?

How does he react to our unbelief?

ALTAR CALL:

Today, I hear the Lord <u>asking his church</u>... <u>Do you believe</u> I still speak to my people? <u>Do you believe</u> I desire to give you my help and guidance? <u>Do you truly believe</u> I want to speak to you daily, hourly, moment by moment?

Our response has to be like David's.

That godly man <u>shook all of hell</u> when he made this statement about the Lord:

<u>Psalm 33:9</u> NKJV - For He spoke, and it was *done;* He commanded, and it stood fast.

Here is <u>God's covenant promise</u> to every generation who <u>would believe his Word</u> that he desires to speak to us:

Psalm 33:11 CEV

¹¹ But what the LORD has planned will stand forever. His thoughts never change.

- The Creator of the universe *wants to share his very thoughts with us!*

More to the point, God wants to speak to you about your problem today.

Won't you come?
