WHY JESUS IS WORTHY OF YOUR FAITH

Heb. 4:13-16 – ¹³ *Nothing in all creation is hidden from God's sight.* Everything is uncovered and laid bare before the eyes of him to whom we must give account.

Jesus the Great High Priest

¹⁴ Therefore, since we have a great high priest who has ascended into heaven, Jesus the Son of God, **let us hold firmly to the faith we profess.**

¹⁵ For we do not have a high priest who is unable to empathize with our weaknesses, but we have one who has been tempted in every way, just as we are—yet he did not sin.

¹⁶ Let us then approach God's throne of grace with confidence, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help us in our time of need.

Intro: These Hebrews were having a tough time vs14

- They were <u>undergoing intense persecution</u> where many were tortured and some killed for their faith.
- Their faith was a daily struggle and **many felt like giving up**.
- Some were very **tempted to give up the public profession** of their faith.

They **wouldn't** stop being saved because they possessed eternal life.

- However, they were willing to **stop proclaiming** Jesus publicly...
- So that they could <u>enjoy an **easier life**</u>.
- We are still **tempted to live outside absolute faith** in the Lord Jesus.

We are tempted to look to every other source of help,

- Rather than turning to the Lord.
- May I remind you that Jesus Christ is still vastly superior...
- God's plan is still that His people live by faith,
- It is easy to lose faith,
- We must avoid <u>the temptation</u> of falling into doubt.

Today, I want to take these few verses and show you <u>why Jesus is worthy</u> of our <u>fait</u>h.

- He can be trusted with anything you will ever have need of in this life.
- If we can trust Jesus to wash our sins away and give us eternal life by faith,
- Then surely we can **trust Him** with life's <u>smaller issues</u>.

Let's look into these verses and see just Why Jesus Is Worthy Of Your Faith.

*HE HAS THE ABILITY TO SEE YOUR PATHWAY vs 13

¹³<u>Nothing</u> in all creation is hidden from God's sight. <u>Everything is uncovered and</u> <u>laid bare before the eyes of him</u> to whom <u>we must give account</u>.

This verse deals expressly with the idea of judgment.

It reminds men that God keeps a perfect record and will, one day, execute swift, accurate judgment,

Rev. 20:11-15 - However, the same attribute that allows God to see all the evil deeds of the wicked, also permits him to **observe the steps of His children.**

Our names are in the Book of Life!!!!!!

A. God Is Constantly Watching Your Path – <u>The eyes of the Lord miss nothing</u>! <u>Prov. 15:3</u> – The eyes of the Lord are everywhere, keeping watch on the wicked and the good.

The Disciples in the storm. They were struggling, but Jesus saw it all -

<u>Mark 6:48</u> - He saw the <u>disciples straining</u> at the oars, because the wind was <u>against them</u>. Shortly before dawn he went out to them, walking on the lake. He was about to pass by them,

- 1. He sees your Trials.....
- 2. He sees your Temptations.....
- 3. He sees your Tears.....

B. God Is Continually Working Out Your Path -

Psa. 37:23 - The Lord makes firm the steps of the one who delights in him;

Prov. 16:9 - In their hearts <u>humans plan their course</u>, but the Lord <u>establishes</u> their steps.

Regardless of <u>where</u> life leads, be sure that <u>God is still in control</u> of all that happens –

<u>Rom. 8:28</u> - And we know that in all things <u>**God works**</u> for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose.

Joseph – <u>**Gen. 50:20</u>** - You intended to harm me, but <u>God intended it for good</u> to accomplish what is now being done, the saving of many lives.</u>

Not everything God does is pleasant, but everything God does is right!

***A small boy was playing with his sailboat at the edge of a lake. <u>When the wind</u> <u>pulled the sailboat away from the shoreline</u> and out of his reach, he began to cry as he saw it moving farther and farther away from him.

An older boy came to the scene and <u>began throwing stones at the boat</u>. The smaller boy cried, <u>'Why are you throwing stones at my boat?</u>' The older boy said, <u>'You don't know what I'm doing. I'm throwing stones on the far side of the boat to create some waves to bring the sailboat back to you</u>.

- Trust me; I know what I'm doing.'
- God knows what He is doing when He throws the stones in our lives.
- They are meant to draw us closer to Him,
- Not to drive us from Him.
- He is not cruel.

During the Second World War metallurgists tested the steel being used to build tanks for American soldiers in the front lines.

- They had to be sure that the metal <u>was not too hard or too soft</u> as it passed through the tempering furnaces.
- Tension was applied to ascertain its breaking point.

- Checks were also taken to make certain that the <u>armor would be</u> <u>bulletproof.</u>
- If any flaws showed up in the steel, it would undergo more tempering.
- When it left the factory, **it was fully prepared to withstand the stress** demanded of it.

So it is with God's children!!!!!!!!!!

- <u>To make us fit</u> for His work and the instruments of His praise,
- He puts us through the kiln of trial and places us in the testing room of life.
- Pressures are **constantly applied** to sanctify us
- And to *reveal the weaknesses* which only <u>His grace can remedy</u>.

C. God Is Confidently Waiting At The End Of Your Path -

- **Everything** God <u>does</u> in your life,
- **Or allows** to happen in your life,
- Is simply <u>*His way of maturing you*</u> into the image of His Son Jesus –

Eph. 4:13 - until we all reach unity in the faith and in the knowledge of the Son of God and become mature, attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ.

• God's desire is that we decrease that He might increase!

**HE HAS THE ABILITY <u>TO SENSE YOUR PAIN</u> vs 15

¹⁵ For <u>we do not</u> have a high priest who is unable to empathize with our weaknesses, but we have <u>one who has</u> been tempted in every way, just as we are—**yet he did not sin.**

A. He Feels Our Pain –

Stephen – <u>Acts 7:55-56</u> - But Stephen, full of the Holy Spirit, looked up to heaven and saw the glory of God, and Jesus standing at the right hand of God. ⁵⁶ "Look," he said, "I see heaven open and the Son of Man standing at the right hand of God." (The Sanhedrin)

Just like Jesus – <u>Forgive them</u> they know what they do....

<u>Stephen</u> – While he could be mad...

- He said look, I see Heaven....
- Just as He felt the pain of Jesus and Stephen,
- He *feels your pain* this morning.
- When you have <u>a need</u> in your life,
- *Heaven is moved* to take care of it.
- Jesus knows what you feel and He loves you.
- When you hurt, <u>He hurts</u>!
- B. He Is Familiar With Our Problems -

Some may ask, "How can Jesus know what I am going through?

- He is perfect and way off up in Heaven.
- <u>How</u> can He possible feel what I feel?"
- *He is able to know* what humans feel because <u>*He has lived* life as a human</u> and has <u>experienced *the same* hardships</u> that you face tonight.
- 1. He Understands Temptation Satan temps Jesus in the desert

<u>Matt. 4:4-11</u> - Jesus answered, "<u>It is written</u>: 'Man shall not live on bread alone, <u>but on every word that comes from the mouth of God.</u>

The nature of His temptations -

<u>1 John 2:16</u> – For everything in the world—the <u>lust of the flesh</u>, the <u>lust of the</u> <u>eyes</u>, and the <u>pride of life</u>—**comes not from the Father** <u>but from the world</u>.

Jesus was tempted in all the same areas where we are tempted today.

- You see, Jesus was not only sinless, but He was, and is, incapable of sinning!
- He has a **<u>hatred for sin</u>** that few of us can imagine.
- Therefore, <u>coming face to face with sin</u> was a horrible event for **Jesus**.
- *He can <u>help you</u> when you are tempted.*

2. He Understands Rejection -

John 6:66 – From this time many of his disciples turned back and no longer followed him.

- He knows what it is like to have the world turn its back on you.
- In fact, He knows what it is like **to face something** that no one in this room will ever experience, if you are saved.

He knows what it is like to have God turn His back to you -

<u>Matt. 27:46</u> - About three in the afternoon Jesus cried out in a loud voice, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"

****He endured these things <u>so that He might help you</u> when you face a time of need in your own life.

- 3. He Understands Poverty And Need –
- Jesus knows what it is like <u>when the ends won't meet</u> no matter how far you stretch them.
- He understands need and <u>is able to offer help</u> during those tough times.
- 4. He Understands Grief John 11:35 Jesus wept.
- Jesus knows exactly what it is like to lose someone you love.
- Therefore, *<u>He can help you</u>* when you <u>face those times of loss</u>.
- Jesus understands human heartbreak.
- 5. He Understands Loneliness –

<u>Matt. 26:39</u> – Going a little farther, he fell with his face to the ground and prayed, <u>"My Father, if it is possible</u>, may this cup be taken from me. <u>Yet not as</u> <u>I will, but as you will."</u>

- *He knows* what it is like to have no one around Him who *understands* what <u>He is going through</u>.
- *He knows* what it means to <u>hurt alone</u>....
- *He knows* how to help you through those <u>troubled times of loneliness</u> also.

***HE HAS THE ABILITY <u>TO SOLVE YOUR PROBLEMS</u> - vs 16

¹⁶ Let us then approach God's throne of grace <u>with confidence</u>, so that we may receive mercy and find grace <u>to help us in our time of need</u>.

A. A Petition –

The Lord gives us **an open invitation** to come to Him for help to get through life.

- Why is it that He who should be our first resort is often our last?
- *We are so guilty* of <u>trying everything else</u> before we seriously seek help from the Lord.
- We will try worry, pity, self-effort,
- Then <u>when everything else fails us</u>, we will run to Jesus and look to Him for the help we could have received a long while before.

Here is God's plan for you in trouble -

<u>1 Pet. 5:7</u> - Cast <u>all</u> your anxiety on him because he cares for you.

B. His Power –

The power of any king is only as great as the power of the kingdom behind him!

With that in mind, just what kind of power does Jesus have?

- 1. He Has **Exceeding** Power –
- 2. He Has Need Meeting Power -
- 3. He Has Cleansing Power -
- 4. He Has <u>Healing</u> Power –
- 5. He Has Load Lifting Power –
- 6. He Had Mountain Moving Power –

7. He Has <u>All</u> Power – **His power** is all summed up in one phrase from <u>*Eph. 3:20,*</u> <u>"He is able."</u>

C. A Promise –

His promise to us is that when we come to Him by faith,

- We will find all that we need *to meet the need* of our heart and life.
- He will give us *exactly* what we need –
- It is still sufficient!!!!!

CLOSE:

Have you been tempted lately to "lose faith?"

- Does it seem that the load you are called to bear just <u>gets too heavy</u> at times?
- Maybe <u>Satan</u>, or *foolish people have encouraged you to give up*.
- Don't give up, come to Jesus!

Jesus - He is <u>ready, willing and able</u> to give you <u>all that you need</u> to get you through whatever you are faced with this morning.

- HE HAS THE ABILITY TO <u>SEE YOUR PATHWAY</u>
- HE HAS THE ABILITY TO SENSE YOUR PAIN
- HE HAS THE ABILITY TO <u>SOLVE YOUR PROBLEMS</u>

If you will trust Jesus with your problem, by faith,

- He will <u>never</u> fail you!
- Is there something you need to bring to Jesus right now?
- If so, just come and <u>let Him have His way</u> in your life.
- <u>He is all you will ever need!</u>
