# Set Me On Fire <u>Once More</u>

Summary: Today we are going to talk about <u>3 sources of fire</u> that God will bring into believers lives!

- It will drive us to our knees, provoke us to much prayer -
- It will reignite our spiritual fervor.
- Fire from the word, the world, and within.

**Set Me on Fire Once More** - In the <u>early 1980's</u> there was a chorus popular in the United States and here are the lyrics:

SET ME ON FIRE - ONCE MORE - I WANT TO LIVE MY LIFE TO PLEASE YOU - IN EVERY WAY - SET ME ON FIRE - ONCE MORE - SO THAT THE WORLD CAN WATCH ME BURN FOR YOU.

*In the words of that song* is the *heartfelt <u>prayer</u> of believer* who has lost his <u>cutting edge</u> and yearns to shine for Jesus once again.

**<u>IN</u>** Ephesians 5:16 NKJV - redeeming the time, because the days are evil.

**Colossians 4:5 NKJV** - Walk in wisdom toward those *who are* outside, redeeming the time.

- We are told we need to redeem time....
- That means, make *the life you are living* valuable as it pertains to eternity.
- Currently half the world is in lock down because of the Corona virus.

So today: I want to talk about *how this time can be redeemed*.

How it can be valuable in the light of eternity -

- I am going to put *a slight twist* on this message though,
- I want to talk about what God's purpose may be, during this crisis -
- And *how we can work together* with <u>Him to redeem the time</u>.

I want to talk about <u>reigniting your spiritual fire</u>, your <u>fervor</u>, your <u>illumination</u> for Christ. There are <u>times in our journey</u> where we may be described as **spiritually stagnating.** 

I want to show how <u>God uses trials</u> like Covid19 <u>to shake us out</u> of <u>the spiritual</u> <u>doldrums.</u>

Jesus said, John 7:38 NKJV - He who believes in Me, as the Scripture has said, out of his heart will flow rivers of living water."

What happens when the river is not flowing, when things are at a standstill?

- May I suggest to you that <u>one strategy God employs</u> is to <u>light a fire</u> under us, and <u>boil the water out</u> of us.
- I know this is a **crude analogy**, but work with me *we are going somewhere good*.

**Today** we are going to talk about <u>**3** sources of fire</u> that God will bring into believers lives. **They are:** 

*Fire* from the *word of God* - Fire from *the world* - Fire *from within*!!!

1<sup>st</sup> - *FIRE FROM THE WORD OF GOD* - What I mean by that:

There are some things in the bible that *as we read them* it creates *an intense longing and desire* to burn for Jesus.

I have 3 fires that come from the word of God to provoke us in a Holy way.

A. <u>The fire of</u> what <u>The Word</u> says I ought to be

- I ought to be <u>a city on a hill</u>.
- I ought to be <u>the light of the world</u>.
- I ought to be <u>bearing much fruit</u>.
- I ought to be **Holy** even as my Father in heaven is holy.

These statements and many others *tell us <u>what we ought to be</u>*, they are a <u>standard by</u> which <u>we can</u> judge our lives.

**Comparing ourselves to these standards** will often drive us to our knees and cry out **like** <u>Isaiah</u> the prophet –

Isaiah 6:5 NKJV - <sup>5</sup> So I said:

# "Woe *is* me, for I am <sup>[a]</sup>undone! (destroyed or cut off)

Because I am a man of unclean lips, And I dwell in the midst of a people of unclean lips; For my eyes have seen the King, The LORD of hosts."

The fire of not fully meeting what the bible calls us to be -

- Will Attract the grace of God to us, as we <u>admit</u> our shortcomings.
- When I recognize I am weak is when I can become strong.
- For when I am weak, then I am strong. 2 Cor. 12:10

\*\*\*\*So, first was the fire of <u>what the word says I ought to be</u>.

B. The fire of *what the word says <u>others have had</u>*, and <u>how they have lived</u>.

As a young Christian I was <u>very inspired by this quote</u> of American evangelist <u>D.L.</u> <u>Moody</u>: "The world has <u>yet to see</u> what God will do with a man fully consecrated to Him"

• Oh how that *challenged me* to be that kind of man!

As I look in the bible and read of <u>Abraham</u>, and <u>David</u>, <u>Noah</u>, <u>Paul</u>, and <u>not just</u> <u>the big names</u> who did great things for God.

But much lesser names like Zacchaeus who was *radically shaken by an encounter with Jesus* and gladly gave up half his goods.

The sinner woman who poured perfume on Jesus feet.

The man who without question gave up his donkey when Jesus asked.

<u>People</u> who have displayed **the highest caliber of** <u>Christian graces</u>, their <u>lives and</u> <u>testimony</u> **provoke me** <u>to be a better follower of Jesus</u>.

When the word tells of the walk they had with God, it creates <u>a fire in my soul</u> to rise to the heights with them.

# C. The third fire from The Word is *what the word says I have*.

- I have the mind of Christ.
- I have the **comforter to lead me** into **all truth**.
- I have the whole armor of God

# Ephesians 1:3 CEV - Christ Brings Spiritual Blessings

Praise the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ for <u>the spiritual blessings</u> that <u>Christ has brought us</u> from heaven!

- God has given us *every spiritual blessing* in the heavenly places in Christ.
- As I compare the life I am living with <u>all I have been provided</u> -
- I am driven to my knees to pray -
- That *I will walk in all that God* has afforded me.

# 2<sup>nd</sup> – THE FIRE THAT COMES FROM THE WORLD

First we looked at <u>things in the word</u> that *provoke us to prayer*, now we will look at <u>things in the world</u> which *provoke us to prayer*.

# A. The needs of the hour

- Is there a famine?
- Is there a plague?
- Is there a serious economic turndown?
- Is immorality on the rise?
- Is there a war?

The needs of the particular hour in which we live will vary, but they call to us and say, "*Christian, <u>how will you help</u> at this time?*"

Many of these challenges far exceed our ability to meet them, and that should always drive us to our knees.

The apostle *Paul once struggled with all the demands on him* as an early church leader, and *in frustration* cried out:

**2 Corinthians 2:16 NKJV** - <sup>16</sup> To the one *we are* the aroma of death *leading* to death, and to the other the aroma of life *leading* to life. <u>And who is sufficient for</u> <u>these things?</u>

A few short verses later he gave the answer to that question as the Holy Spirit inside bubbled up with a response:

**2 Corinthians 3:5 NKJV** - <sup>5</sup> Not that we are sufficient of ourselves to think of anything as *being* from ourselves, but *our sufficiency is from God*,

We don't have the right to claim that we have done anything on our own. God gives us what it takes to do all that we do.

# B. The second fire from the world is: THE NEEDS OF OTHERS

- Sick people we meet.
- People going through a divorce.
- People coping with the death of loved ones.
- People who lose their source of income.
- People without food or homes.
- People who are depressed or suicidal.

# <u>All these needs of others</u> demand that <u>the grace of God</u> be more powerful in our lives as believers.

- These needs daily humble us with *the inability to meet* many of them.
- But that **humility is the gateway** to *the grace of God*.
- For whoever humbles himself <u>will be exalted</u> and -
- Whoever exalts himself *will be humbled*.

#### C. The third fire from the world is: PERSONAL NEEDS

- Physical sickness/or pain.
- Transportation/clothing/shelter
- Finances

#### This area is probably the one most Christians pray the most about

• Yet it is the one Jesus said we should care the least about -

- Because **He will take care of our** earthly needs.
- Be that as it may,
- The fact that **these things** <u>get us on our knees</u> is a good thing.

### 3<sup>rd</sup> – THE FIRE *THAT COMES FROM WITHIN*

#### A. The fire of personal weaknesses

- Fear of public speaking
- Insecurities
- Lack of skills/training
- Emotional volatility

#### Again we should <u>never accept to be stuck</u> in these things:

- But let them *drive us to our knees*
- Where <u>we will find</u> grace and power <u>to overcome</u>.

#### B. The fire of personal failings

- Sin
- We all fail and come short in many ways -
- But we cannot allow ourselves to ever become comfortable with sin.
- God has two words for sin,
- And <u>they are not</u>, "*I understand*," they are, "stop it!"

**Personal sin** <u>*needs to be overcome in the prayer closet*</u>, by claiming what Jesus did on Calvary.

# C. The fire of personal problems

- **Conflict** with others at home or on the job.
- **Stress** about bills and deadlines.
- Fatigue.
- **Troubled** relationships
- Sickness.

God uses all these things to provoke us and push us into the prayer closet where we can be energized by His Spirit to overcome in every area.

We are in a time where all three of these fires are coming against many people in the world,

But with the grace of God we can turn them around and make them work for good.

We can redeem the time, by praying until we have breakthrough.
