What's Wrong With The Gospel

Galatians 1:6-9 NIV - No Other Gospel - Only One Gospel

⁶I am astonished that you are so quickly deserting the one who called you to live in the grace of Christ and are turning to a different gospel— ⁷ which is really no gospel at all. Evidently some people are throwing you into confusion and are trying to pervert the gospel of Christ. ⁸ But even if we or an angel from heaven should preach a gospel other than the one we preached to you, let them be under God's curse! ⁹ As we have already said, so now I say again: If anybody is preaching to you a gospel other than what you accepted, let them be under God's curse!

Romans 1:16-17 NIV – The Just Live by Faith

¹⁶ For I am not ashamed of the gospel, because it is the power of God that <u>brings</u> <u>salvation</u> to everyone who <u>believes</u>: first to the Jew, then to the Gentile. ¹⁷ For in the gospel the righteousness of <u>God is revealed</u>—<u>a righteousness that is by faith</u> from first to last, just as it is written: "The righteous will live by faith."

- Obviously, *nothing is wrong with the Gospel* of the Bible what the Apostles devoted their lives to.
- But what about **the "gospel"** that is being preached in most churches and Christian literature today?
- **Do they really preach <u>the same message</u>** the <u>whole message</u> about **Bible** salvation?
- How do they answer the question that people are still asking the Church,
 "Men and brethren, what shall we do (to be saved)?"
- Do they answer <u>as the Apostles answered</u>, or do they <u>deviate from it?</u>

The word "gospel" is from the Anglo-Saxon word **"godspel," Meaning "god-message" or "good story."**

- We use the transliterated term "good news" in place of the Greek word "euaggelion," and usually <u>think of it as meaning</u> ONLY the good tidings themselves.
- However, in the Greek language the word "euaggelion" actually signifies "a present given to one who brought good tidings," or "a sacrifice offered in thanksgiving for such good tidings having come."

Therefore, the "gospel" signifies <u>NOT ONLY the message</u> of the <u>death</u>, <u>burial</u> and <u>resurrection</u> of Christ (the "good news")

BUT <u>ALSO</u> our response in "thanksgiving for such good tidings having come" – (obeying the plan of salvation).

Paul called this **"MY GOSPEL" Romans 2:16** NIV - ¹⁶ This will take place on the day when God judges people's secrets through Jesus Christ, as my gospel declares.

<u>God revealed</u> to him that <u>the full doctrinal content</u> of the Gospel

- Embodied not only our **relationship on** *the basis of grace*
- But also our responsibilities on <u>the basis of gratitude</u>.
- This is why most of his epistles are divided between doctrinal and practical teaching.
 This is the REAL gospel!

Therefore, you are <u>NOT</u> preaching <u>Paul's gospel</u> if you preach "only believe!" <u>Furthermore</u>, you are not preaching <u>Paul's gospel</u> if you preach "repent, be baptized, receive the Holy Spirit … and <u>stop</u>!"

The gospel of the New Testament **BEGINS** with <u>the working of God's grace in</u> **SALVATION**, but **MUST CONTINUE** <u>with the working of God's grace</u> in **SANCTIFICATION**, or it is **NOT COMPLETE**.

The gospel is <u>not</u> the gospel if you <u>take away</u> from it or <u>add to it</u>

- <u>It will not work</u> if you do that!
- Paul says, "If any man preach any other gospel unto you than that ye have received, let him be cursed."
- "anathema" something or someone that one <u>vehemently dislikes</u> or
- "devoted to destruction".
- This applies to those that <u>mix God's message</u> with <u>men's ideas</u>, creating a "perverted gospel."
- The Judaizers of Paul's day did not deny Christ; they merely changed the plan of salvation preached by his Apostles. Many today do the same!
- Jesus Christ would be angered by most "gospel" messages that are being preached today, mainly because <u>they lack nearly all the major points</u> that <u>He and the Apostles</u> preached on!

WHAT HAS BEEN CHANGED?

**THE BLOOD OF JESUS

- It's a fact that strong preaching of the blood of Jesus scares people;
- it's also a fact that His blood scares the devil,
- because it is the only cleansing agent for man's soul.
- A bloodless gospel will not save anyone.
- Remove the blood and you remove the power!

**THE CROSS OF JESUS - Today we preach "Jesus Christ and what He can do for you" instead of "Jesus Christ and Him crucified."

- A me-centered gospel is the enemy of <u>a Christ-centered gospel</u>.
- Anyone preaching <u>self-denial</u> as a condition of discipleship is called "legalistic"
 but <u>Jesus did!</u>
- The sinner is not the <u>center of God's plan</u> Jesus is!
- He never lowered the requirements for anyone.

"The cross is the most revolutionary thing ever to appear among men.

- The cross of Roman times **knew no compromise**, it <u>never made concessions</u>.
- It won all its arguments by killing its opponent and silencing him for good.
- It spared <u>not</u> Christ, but <u>slew Him</u> the same as the rest.
- **He was alive** when <u>they hung Him</u> on that cross, and **completely dead** when <u>they took Him</u> off of it.
- That was the cross the <u>first time</u> it appeared in Christian history.

With perfect knowledge of all this, <u>Christ said</u>, 'If any man will come after Me, let him deny himself, take up his cross and follow Me.'

- So the cross not only brought Christ's life to an end
- It also <u>ends the first life</u>, <u>the old life</u> of every one of His <u>true followers</u> ... this and <u>nothing less</u> is <u>true</u> Christianity.

We <u>must do something</u> about the cross, and there's only <u>one of two things</u> we can do - <u>flee it</u> or <u>die upon it!</u>"

***THE TERROR OF HELL. We have decided to help God out because we understand our generation better than He does!

They need a more gentle, loving message than what He preached.

- We talk about Heaven and the rewards of salvation
- But neglect the other side of the gospel's "two-edged sword."

What right do we have <u>to omit hell from preaching</u> when **Jesus gave emphasis to** it?

***THE LAW OF GOD. When the rich young ruler came to Jesus, he asked a very direct question: "Good Master, what must I do to inherit eternal life?"

Can you imagine what today's preachers would answer him?

- "Admit you're a sinner, accept Jesus as your personal Savior, etc...
- But what was Jesus' answer?
- **"You know the commandments ...** keep the commandments." (Mark 10:19, Matthew 19:17) **THE COMMANDMENTS?!**
- **Didn't Jesus** *do away* with the law?

Jesus wasn't preaching the commandments to him as the way of salvation,

- He was <u>using the commandments</u> to specifically <u>convict him</u> of his particular sin (which was greed).
- Jesus knew how to "flush him out" by preaching the Law of God.

That's exactly what the Law is for:

Romans 3:20 "For through the Law comes the knowledge of sin"

• The Law must be preached, not as the way of salvation, but <u>as a searchlight</u> on the sinner's heart so they can see how bad they really are.

Galatians 3:24 "Wherefore the law was our schoolmaster to bring us unto Christ, that we might be justified by faith."

There are <u>no</u> "dos and don'ts" in today's preaching because <u>we don't want to</u> <u>scare</u> the "liberated generation" away.

• If we condemned <u>fornication</u>, <u>abortion</u> or <u>any other specific sin</u>, **people might feel condemned.**

But that's the point - <u>Jesus preached the Law</u> so the rich young ruler would feel condemned enough to feel his need of a Savior.

The modern gospel dwells on "all the good things God will do for you if you just accept Him" in place of conviction.

But <u>only by</u> the preaching of the Law can a person desire to be <u>saved from sin</u>.

Romans 7:7 "I had not know sin, but by the Law."

***THE FEAR OF GOD. Jesus is pictured today as so loving and so forgiving that He wouldn't hurt a fly.

But what happened to,

Hebrews 10:31 "It is a <u>fearful thing</u> to fall into the hands of the living God" Proverbs 9:10 "The <u>fear</u> of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom"

Modern preaching emphasizes <u>only God's kindness</u>, but ignores <u>the balance</u> presented in God's Word.

Romans 11:22 "Behold then the kindness and severity of God."

***GOD'S BROKEN HEART OVER SIN.

- God saw every person who was <u>raped, murdered, abused</u> today.
- **He saw** every <u>pornographic film</u> and every <u>filthy act</u>.
- How can anyone <u>believe</u> that He sees this and <u>does not grieve</u>?
- But the church has created a carefree and cheerful God in their modern gospel.
- They <u>don't</u> want a God <u>who is grieved</u> with sin, because then He would be grieved with them!

***REPENTANCE - Conversion cannot happen without real repentance!

Jesus said, Luke 13:3 "Except ye repent, ye shall all likewise perish."

- His teachings and those of the Apostles are full of commands to repent.
- Repentance is not just "being sorry" that is only conviction.
- Repentance is <u>not merely a change of heart</u> and mind <u>it is a change</u> of ACTION!
- We must turn from sin to be saved! But <u>repentance is impossible</u> where <u>the Law does not convict the sinner</u> of his wickedness.

***BAPTISM. Paul taught that baptism is New Testament circumcision.

In the Old Testament, a male was not in Covenant relationship with God until he was circumcised. Everyone not so circumcised was to be "cut off from his people" as having "broken My covenant." (Genesis 17:14)

In the New Testament, we're *called into Covenant with God* when we are baptized in Jesus' name.

Colossians 2:9-15 NIV

⁹ For in Christ all the fullness of the Deity lives in bodily form, ¹⁰ and in Christ you have been brought to fullness. He is the head over every power and authority. ¹¹ In him you were also <u>circumcised with a circumcision not performed by human hands</u>. Your whole self-ruled by the flesh was <u>put off when you were circumcised by Christ</u>, ¹² having been <u>buried with him in baptism</u>, in which you were also <u>raised with him through your faith in the working of God</u>, who raised him from the dead. ¹³ When you were dead in your sins and in the <u>uncircumcision of your flesh</u>, God made you alive with Christ. <u>He forgave us all our sins</u>, ¹⁴ having <u>canceled the charge of our legal indebtedness</u>, <u>which stood against us and condemned us</u>; he has taken it away, nailing it to the cross. ¹⁵ And having disarmed the powers and authorities, he made a public spectacle of them, triumphing over them by the cross.

***RECEIVING THE HOLY SPIRIT. Jesus was crucified and buried by man, but rose from the dead by His own power.

- We fulfil His death and burial by <u>repenting and being baptized</u>; these are acts of men.
- God does His part ("resurrection") by filling us with the Holy Spirit after we have done our part.

***THE NECESSITY OF HOLINESS. Possibly the greatest insult to the gospel today is the almost *total neglect of the preaching of holiness* for the Christian.

Because people are not being convicted by the Law of God and driven to the cross,

 We then have to <u>invent doctrines</u> to explain <u>why</u> these supposed "Christians" still have no desire to live for God! But the Bible says, 1 John 1:6 "If we say that we have fellowship with him, and walk in darkness, we lie, and do not the truth."

Hebrews 12:14 NIV - Warning and Encouragement

¹⁴ Make every effort to live in peace with everyone and to be holy; <u>without</u> holiness no one will see the Lord.

• If you call yourself a Christian but are still (perhaps secretly) <u>living in your sin</u>, what you need to do is to <u>really</u> repent!

***THE ALTAR CALL. The only "altar call" in the Bible is the call to

Romans 12:1 NIV - A Living Sacrifice

Therefore, I urge you, brothers and sisters, *in view of God's mercy*, to offer your bodies <u>as a living sacrifice</u>, **holy and pleasing to God**—this is your true and proper worship.

- The altar call as we know it was invented only about 150 years ago, first used by the American evangelist Charles Finney
- As a means of separating out those **who wanted to talk further about salvation** (he called the front pew **"the anxious seat".**
- It was developed further, and many <u>early revivals would stay at the altar</u> *all night confessing their sins* (some even a few days!).
- But gradually, the altar call became a fixed part of every meeting,
- Like all traditions *lost its original spirit as "coming forward"* became more important than "repentance."

How many confused sinners have left altars being told they were saved after repeating a sinner's prayer, **but knowing differently in their heart?**

Having someone <u>repeat a prayer</u> and pronouncing them "saved"

- Takes away <u>the conviction of the Holy Spirit</u> prematurely,
- Before **repentance** <u>can lead to **salvation**</u>.

A true sinner's prayer will gush out of <u>anyone who is truly seeking God</u> and <u>tired</u> <u>of being enslaved to sin</u>! God would rather see <u>one true convert</u> than an ocean full of "decisions."

CLOSE: What have we done to the Gospel?

****GOD'S WITNESSES. The world around us is going to hell - not because of rock music, television, drugs, sex, alcohol or the devil himself.

It is because of the church! We are to blame!

- Only we have the commission,
- Power and truth of God at our disposal to deliver sinners from eternal death.

We are taking a <u>watered-down</u>, <u>distorted version</u> of God's message which He <u>has</u> not promised to anoint.

And that is why Christianity as a whole is failing.

The only hope for the world is in the hands of <u>real Christians</u> who will "<u>Let Me</u> <u>Show You Jesus!</u>"

The Bible says, Isaiah 43:10 - "You are my witnesses," declares the Lord, "and my servant whom I have chosen, so that you may know and believe me and understand that I am he.

- Before me <u>no god</u> was formed, nor will there <u>be one after me</u>
- Sinners have next to nothing in their lives to <u>make an impression on them</u> in respect to eternity.
- If they were <u>forced to examine</u> the subject, **they would be moved greatly** –
- But they do not think about it and never will - -
- Unless God's witnesses rise up and testify!

PRAISE TEAM - LET ME SHOW YOU JESUS!!!

- But considering the way most Christians live, it seems they're testifying for the other side!
- Do you think the preacher can bring revival by preaching while <u>we live the</u> way we do?
- Our influence stands in the way of revival! And our "witness" exerts <u>eternal</u> influence!
