What Do You Do When You Find Yourself In The Pit?

Genesis 37:1-19 - When we read the story of Joseph there are some things that cannot be denied, because the scripture makes it clear that:

- Joseph was chosen by God, Joseph was anointed by God
- Joseph had <u>a destiny given by God</u>, Joseph was <u>favored by God</u>
- Joseph was favored by his earthly father, God was with Joseph

That sounds like a winning combination, judging from that criteria it would look like Joseph had it made, it would seem as though he was living the life of riley (You would expect to find his book under lifestyles of the rich and famous by Joseph)

But when we read the Bible we find out that **this same Joseph** who had everything going for him, who was **anointed by God**, who was **favored by** his earthly father and had so many great advantages;

One day Joseph found himself in a pit

I want to stop here for just a minute and tell you;

- If somebody told you when you became a Christian
- that all your problems would be over
- that you would <u>never be hurt again</u>
- you would <u>never cry again</u>,
- you would <u>never suffer again</u>....... (They Lied)

Psalm 34:19 - Many *are* the afflictions of the righteous, But the LORD delivers him out of them all.

The point I'm trying to make is that Christians have problems too

- Christians get sick, Christians get in debt
- Christians <u>get divorced</u>, Christians <u>get their hearts broken</u>, Christians <u>get in</u> <u>places they shouldn't be</u>.

Sometimes you fall in, sometimes you jump in, and sometimes you're pushed in.

But regardless of how you got there or why you're there, a Pit is a Pit and <u>if you</u> <u>stay there you will die.</u>

Dreams <u>die in the pit</u>, **ministries** <u>die in the pit</u>, gifts, callings, marriages, die in the pit)

- **<u>Rueben was responsible</u>** for Joseph's pit.
- It was Rueben that suggested they throw Joseph in the pit.
- We don't know what happened but whatever it was; we know this
- (Rueben was there when Joseph was thrown into the pit, but he was not there when he was lifted out)

The point is: Rueben was surprised, Rueben was shocked,

- Because he saw him go into the pit,
- he saw him <u>struggling and begging</u> to be delivered from the pit

But now he's **looking into that same pit** expecting to see pitiful Joseph full of fear and confusion stressing and crying and begging to be delivered (but Joseph wasn't there)

Some of you are going through something and I know it, it's obvious because I can tell by just observing you <u>the things you say</u>, <u>the way you act</u>, it tells me **there is some things that <u>you need to overcome</u>**.

You're in the pit -

- There are some people that even helped put you in the pit,
- They have watched you struggling, and pushing, and scratching and clawing
- Trying to <u>climb your way out</u>,

But I came to tell you, you are coming out of the pit,

- I'm not just preaching, I'm prophesying,
- I am declaring to you with **prophetic unction and authority** that you are coming out.
- I wish somebody would have faith right now and say: *I'm coming out*
- I don't know what that pit is for you today: <u>It may be a pit of debt</u>
- It may be <u>a pit of sickness</u> It may be a <u>pit of bondage</u>, or <u>addiction</u>
- It may be a <u>pit of despair</u>, <u>depression</u>

- It may be <u>a pit of marriage problems</u> that **looks so deep and so dark** and **impossible** that <u>you feel like giving up</u>
- It may be <u>a spiritual pit</u> and **you just don't feel God** like you used to, and you're <u>dry and discouraged</u>.

I don't know what your pit is: They come in all different shapes and sizes.

I don't know what that pit is for you:

But I want you to say right now by faith I've spent my last night in the pit!!!

Psalm 30:5 - ⁵ For His anger *is but for* a moment, His favor *is for* life; *Weeping may endure for a night, But joy comes in the morning.*

Rueben came back to the pit where he last saw Joseph, and Joseph wasn't there.

- There are some people that <u>thought they knew you</u> pretty good;
- They thought they knew where to look for you.
- They even **talked about your pitiful** condition to other people

But that was <u>yesterday</u> I was in the pit,

- Yesterday it looked like I was going to die in the pit.
- Yesterday I felt like <u>I was going to die in the pit</u> **But I heard a word**:
- <u>Don't</u> die in the Pit;
- The fall <u>doesn't</u> have to be fatal

Don't die in the pit:

- Don't quit dreaming
- Don't quit <u>believing</u>:
- Don't quit trusting,
- don't quit <u>expecting</u>

It looked like Joseph was going to die in the pit,

- but through a turn of circumstances in a matter of minutes
- Joseph was up out of the pit on solid ground.

I came to tell you God is going to turn it around:

- I don't know how he's going to do it
- I don't know when he's going to do it

I come to tell you (he's going to turn it around)

If you <u>learn anything from the bible</u> it is that **God is a God of the turnaround**. Joseph, Job, Daniel, The three Hebrew Children, Jonah, Jesus.

From <u>Genesis to Revelation</u> God is turning it around And *if you haven't been convinced* yet, all you have to do is *look in the mirror*.

Some of you may have been <u>pushers</u>, some of you were <u>thieves and liars</u>, some of you were <u>adulterators and fornicators</u>, some of you were <u>alcoholics and drug</u> <u>addicts</u>.

But that was the old man: **That was Before Jesus. Tell yourself** <u>I've had a turn around</u>. Now I want you to see something: <u>It happened suddenly</u>

One minute he was in the pit, one minute <u>he was in the dark</u>, one minute <u>it was</u> <u>terminal</u>, one minute <u>it looked like the end</u>, and **suddenly** <u>everything</u> changed.

- Suddenly he was standing in the sunshine
- In <u>an instant</u> everything changed,
- in one minute what was terminal and staring him in the face
- was over and behind him.
- I believe you are standing on the verge of a suddenly
- that is going to **<u>change everything</u>**.

Peter fished all night and <u>caught nothing</u>, but in <u>one act of obedience</u> (suddenly) he went <u>from nothing</u> to too much.

He went from <u>empty nets</u> to <u>breaking nets</u>, He went from <u>empty boat</u> to <u>sinking</u> <u>boat</u>,

From loss to profit from weeping to rejoicing from a loser to a winner (suddenly).

At the lowest point in Josephs life physically and spiritually, God stepped in.

JUDAH GOT HIM OUT (PRAISE) it <u>wasn't his coat of many colors</u> **that got him out**, <u>it wasn't his anointing</u> that got him out, <u>it wasn't even his dreams</u> that got him out.

(It was an ugly old Judah) JUDAH means PRAISE----

Rueben got him in, but Judah got him out

- I don't care how you got in the pit
- I don't care who it was or what it was.

I came to tell you, Judah {Praise} will get you out

The circumstances may not have been <u>of Josephs choosing</u> nevertheless <u>Judah</u> <u>was responsible</u> for getting him <u>out of the pit</u>.

The point I'm trying to make is that (*Praise doesn't have to be pretty to be powerful*)

Start where you are.

- Anybody can put on <u>a pretty praise</u> when the battles over
- Anybody can praise God <u>when the sickness is healed</u>
- Anybody can praise God <u>when the marriage is restored</u> and the family is mended
- When you've got a good retirement,
- money in your wallet and money in the bank
- anybody can praise God

But I'm telling you, it takes something to shout in the face of the devil,

It takes something <u>to praise in the face of the doctors bad report</u>, It takes something <u>to shout when you don't have two nickels to rub together</u>, It takes something <u>when you're going through the fire</u>, **to lift your hands and lift your voice and say:**

I will bless the lord at all times his praise shall continually be in my mouth.

The point is: Don't wait till the battles over (shout now)

Start in the dark with the walls closing in on you

Start where you are <u>laying in that hospital bed</u> **Start where you are** <u>at the bottom</u> <u>of that pit</u>

Start where you are in the middle of your pain

Start where you are in the inner prison at midnight, with your hands and your feet bound and your back bloody, beaten black and blue.

It may not be pretty (In fact it may be ugly) but give God Praise.

How many know that **some people have a problem** <u>with real praisers</u>? **Real praisers** <u>get loud</u>, real praisers <u>get undignified</u>, Real praisers <u>can get messy</u>; <u>they don't worry</u> about their hair or anything Real praisers <u>can get offensive</u> **to pretty praisers**,

Pretty praisers know how to control their praise, and pretty praisers <u>never mess</u> <u>up their hair</u>.

They <u>don't get loud</u> and **they wouldn't think of** <u>running or jumping</u>, or <u>dancing</u>.

But God said to tell you: <u>He wants your Praise</u>.

- God wants your Praise through your tears and your groans,
- He wants it while your heart is breaking—
- He wants it through your bloodshot eyes.
- He wants it when it don't make no sense,
- He wants it loud,
- he wants it crazy

He wants it when you're going through hell. He wants it when you don't feel a thing.

I'm trying to get pass this: but I feel like somebody here, **you've been trying to get everything prim and proper**, your <u>waiting till everything is just perfect</u>, you want to give God a fancy praise, you want to <u>dress it all up and make it pretty</u>.

But God said to tell you: Just give him your Ugly Praise

Because he's going to use your **<u>UGLY PRAISE</u>** to <u>get you out</u>.

Job lost everything that he had:

But after **he had lost everything** (his heart was breaking into a million pieces, <u>more tragedy than a human being should ever have to endure</u>) **but in the middle of it all**,

• Job gave God an <u>Ugly Praise</u>.

The Bible says: <u>He arose</u>, he <u>rent his mantle</u>, he <u>shaved his head</u> and he f<u>ell down</u> <u>on the ground</u> and <u>he worshipped</u>.

It wasn't a pretty sight: He worshipped through tears: He worshipped through groans He worshipped with a broken heart: He worshipped through his pain, through his confusion He gave God an Ugly praise and God gave him a Beautiful future.

His worship <u>kept him connected</u> to <u>his destiny</u> and <u>in the end</u> God blessed him</u> with more, restored everything and gave him double.

We don't have <u>the benefit of choosing the problems and trials</u> and <u>afflictions</u> that come our way in life, <u>divorce</u>, and <u>sickness</u>, the <u>loss of a loved one</u>, <u>debt</u>, <u>false accusations</u>, and <u>betrayal</u>.

But I can choose my praise: My weapon of choice is Praise, Praise is a weapon

You see **the devils purpose for the pit** *is to kill your praise*. The devil hates your praise.

The devil knows (*if you ever get your praise on he's in trouble*)

Joseph was not the only man of God who ever found himself in a pit:

Psalm 40:2 – David said: ² He also brought me up out of a horrible pit, Out of the miry clay, And set my feet upon a rock, *And* established my steps.

Jeremiah the Prophet found himself in a horrible pit:

Jeremiah 38:12 - ¹² Then Ebed-Melech the Ethiopian said to Jeremiah, "Please put these old clothes and rags under your armpits, under the ropes." And Jeremiah did so.

They offered Jeremiah:

- Gods man, the Prophet of God, Mighty man of faith and power, **old thrown out filthy rotten stinking rags.**
- And he put them under his arms and they lifted him out

Someone is not going to like this:

• But the reason some of you haven't got <u>out</u> of your pit yet is you're too proud.

Yeah you want to praise God on your terms,

- you want to praise God when something big happens,
- You want to praise God <u>when you feel like it</u>;
- you want to praise God <u>when it makes sense</u>.
- You want to praise God <u>moderately</u>, <u>conveniently</u>, <u>quietly</u>.

Your pride is <u>keeping you bound</u>, your pride is <u>keeping you in the pit</u>, and your pride is <u>keeping you from your miracle</u>.

Isa. 61:3 - Put on the garment of praise for the spirit of heaviness:

<u>He didn't say</u> it would be <u>easy</u>, he didn't say it <u>would feel good</u>, he didn't say it <u>would be pretty</u>

As a matter of fact it's pretty easy to see that *he's talking about going from* <u>a low</u> <u>place to a high place</u>,

He's talking about <u>moving out of heaviness</u> into praise, he's talking about <u>getting something off</u> and <u>putting something better on</u>.

- I came to tell somebody today: my praise may look like old rags to you,
- It may sometime look extravagant, it may be extreme,
- It may be emotional, it may be loud, it may even be offensive,

And some may even go so far <u>as to call it ugly</u>,

But that's alright: it was an Ugly praise that brought Joseph out of the pit,

- It was an <u>Ugly praise</u> that **brought Jeremiah out of the Pit**
- It was an <u>Ugly praise</u> that brought <u>Paul and Silas out of their Prison</u>.
- And God said <u>he would use Ugly Praise</u> to get you out of your pit, and <u>turn</u> <u>your situation around</u>.

I wish I had some people in here, which still had some old rags hanging in your closet and you're not too proud to put on an Ugly praise.

I know <u>we're all dressed up smelling good</u>, <u>looking good</u> (but don't throw away those old rags).

Jeremiah would tell you: Don't throw away those old rags (God will use them to get you out).

David would tell you: Don't throw away those old rags (God will use them to get you out of your pit).

After many years of the ark of God being absent from Israel David the King finally brings it home.

<u>The ark symbolizing</u>: the <u>presence</u>, the <u>guidance</u>, the <u>protection</u>, the <u>favor</u> of God to his people.

David was so excited about bringing the ark back that the bible says:

- He danced before the Lord with all his might.
- (He danced right out of his Kingly Apparel)
- David's wife saw him dancing and <u>despised him</u> in her heart: (His praise <u>embarrassed</u> her)

2 Samuel 6:20 - ²⁰ Then David returned to bless his household. And Michal the daughter of Saul came out to meet David, and said, "How glorious was the king of Israel today, uncovering himself today in the eyes of the maids of his servants, as one of the base fellows ^[a]shamelessly uncovers himself!"

What she was saying was: That was <u>shameful</u>, that was <u>embarrassing</u>, that was <u>ugly</u>, and that was <u>humiliating</u>.

David could have said: <u>Your right</u> honey, that was <u>no way for a King to act</u>, I **should have** <u>composed myself</u>,

I should have <u>behaved myself better</u>, I'm sorry <u>that I embarrassed you</u>. But he didn't.

I'm paraphrasing: But what David said was *(if you thought that was embarrassing* And *if you thought that was shameful:* And if you <u>thought that was Ugly</u>, you <u>haven't seen anything yet</u>.

2 Samuel 6:21-22 - ²¹ So David said to Michal, "*It was* before the LORD, who chose me instead of your father and all his house, to appoint me ruler over the people of the LORD, over Israel. Therefore I will play *music* before the LORD. ²² And I will be even more undignified than this, and will be humble in my own sight. But as for the maidservants of whom you have spoken, by them I will be held in honor."

What David was saying was:

- If you didn't like my last praise,
- if you thought my last praise was over the top,
- If you thought my last praise was embarrassing,
- if you thought <u>my last praise was Ugly</u>.
- You <u>haven't</u> seen anything yet.

CLOSE: I wish some of you **would quit worrying about what everybody else thinks** and

- just give God the Best praise you have,
- don't dress it up,
- don't pretty it up,
- don't tidy it up, **Just give it up**.

Joseph was in a pit and they expected him to die there:

• But an Ugly Judah got him out.

Jeremiah was in a pit and they expected him to die there, but some Ugly rags got him out

Paul and Silas were in the Inner prison embarrassed, humiliated, beaten black and blue, But in the middle of their pain <u>they gave God an Ugly Praise</u>

and (God shook the prison off its foundations and every cell was opened and every prisoners bonds were broken).

There are some people that expected you to die in the pit, but <u>you're going to</u> <u>disappoint them</u>,

• There's an anointing in you that's bigger than the pit

When Joseph was thrown into the Pit it was empty, but he filled it with praise---

- If they had filled it with dirt it would have been his grave
- But he filled it with praise and he came out.
- If you're not too proud to <u>put on some old rags</u>,
- if you're not too proud to <u>put on an Ugly Praise</u>

• You can <u>praise your way out</u>, you can <u>shout your way out</u> You can <u>dance your way out</u> you can <u>run your way out</u>

You can fill your pit with praise and when that pit gets filled with praise, it will spit you out, Just like the whale spit out Jonah.

When Jonah came out of that whale's belly <u>he wasn't pretty</u>, but <u>he was free</u>, <u>he was out</u>.

He came out ugly, but <u>he came out</u>.

Somebody's coming out today:

God's going to use your ugly praise to turn it around.
