# Because He Lives!

Mark 1:16-18 - Jesus Calls His First Disciples - <sup>16</sup> As Jesus walked beside the Sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and his brother Andrew casting a net into the lake, for they were fishermen. <sup>17</sup> "Come, follow me," Jesus said, "and <u>I will send you out to fish for people</u>." <sup>18</sup> At once they left their nets and followed him.

#### **TO HAVE PRUPOSE**

- Here we find the Lord walking down by the wayside and here he finds two men whom we know now as **Peter and Andrew**.
- They are fishing here in the ocean and I don't know how well they were doing but no doubt at their best they were the least among men.

Notice the Lord said, "I will make you fishers of men",

- I don't know if they understood what that meant
- But notice they did not hesitate either as the Bible says,
- "They forsook their nets and followed him".

This was their livelihood and for them to so quickly forsake it would tell us a lot about what they thought of their life at this point.

Christ knew their hearts and knew that *without him they had no purpose*.

THE PARALLEL - This text is a great parallel of how Christ found us.

- We were the least among men even at our greatest moments
- Whether we thought we had the biggest catch or not
- We were empty and without purpose.

Thank God that the Lord walks by the wayside in life to catch the lowliest of men.

- He took you and I who were *fishing for something*,
- Really, we were fishing for anything that would bring <u>happiness or peace</u> to our lives,

- But seemingly every time we got a big catch it got away.
- He took me and you and gave us purpose and identity,
- he said, "I will make you fishers of men".

#### Just as Simon Peter we have <u>purpose and identity</u>.

It doesn't matter what comes my way or what I may <u>gain or lose</u> in this life because *I know now why I am here*.

#### I know now who I serve, and I know him personally.

#### WITHOUT PURPOSE

John 21:3 - <sup>3</sup> "I'm going out to fish," Simon Peter told them, and they said, "We'll go with you." So, they went out and got into the boat, but that night they caught nothing.

#### Now suddenly the man has changed.

- He was so happy and content and full of life and purpose,
- but now he is ready to go back to the old life of emptiness again.

#### What has made this difference?

- <u>Christ has been crucified</u> and now it seems that once again life is the winner
- And once again his life is pointless and without purpose.

# He is going to <u>go back</u> to fishing again back to <u>the only thing he knows</u>, just existing.

I thought about this scripture, and <u>I think I can understand where</u> *Simon* is coming <u>from</u>. You know without Christ I can see how:

A man who has just <u>lost everything</u>, his wife, kids, might set down and consider suicide. *The only thing that <u>gave him purpose</u> in life <u>is gone</u> and there is no reason to think he might ever have it again.* 

A person who lives for their job, a person who has <u>allowed their job</u> to be the center of their life might let down after losing it all and think. <u>Why try</u>?

Why work your whole life for something, or somebody?

- Suffer and toil through *trial after trial* and *trouble after trouble*
- Only to one day *lose it all* or even if you did keep it,
- You would one day die and rot *with no hope* or eternity beyond the grave.
- That is what the world lives for and thinks like.

Thanks be to God that we can have <u>purpose and hope</u> for our lives and our eternity. Why?

# Because he lives!

**Mark 16:5-7** - <sup>5</sup> As they entered the tomb, they saw a young man dressed in a white robe sitting on the right side, and they were alarmed.

<sup>6</sup> "Don't be alarmed," he said. "You are looking for Jesus the Nazarene, who was crucified. He has risen! He is not here. See the place where they laid him. <sup>7</sup> But go, tell his disciples and Peter, 'He is going ahead of you into Galilee. There you will see him, just as he told you.'"

**GO TELL PETER -** If Christ <u>*wouldn't have*</u> rose from the dead, Peter would have just been nobody and nothing, just existing and no reason no point,

Because he rose again Peter had hope, and reason, and potential.

## We need to go tell the world that Christ has risen and there is abundant Life.

John 10:9-10 - <sup>9</sup> *I am the gate; whoever enters through me will be saved.* They will come in and go out, and find pasture. <sup>10</sup> The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy; I have come that they may have life and have it to the full.

## NO END – Some have said, "all good things must come to an end"

I tell you today all things may die but not all things must end.

If you are in Christ there is no end, for Christ is eternal.

When a seed is planted it must first die, but after it dies a plant springs forth from it, and <u>life is more abundant</u> for that seed than ever before.

I want to tell you in the world all good things come to an end, but <u>in Christ</u> there is life and life more abundant.

- You may *lose your job*, but that just means life is coming,
- You may *lose your family* but get ready *for God to make it better* than it ever was.
- You may *lose a loved one* but they are <u>not ended</u> but *beginning in eternity*.

*Death is death to <u>the unbeliever</u>* but **to the saint of God** <u>it is a separation from</u> <u>dead things</u> **to eternal living things. Why?** 

Because he lives. - 1 Corinthians 15:53-55 - <sup>53</sup> For the perishable must clothe itself with the imperishable, and the mortal with immortality. <sup>54</sup> When the perishable has been clothed with the imperishable, and the mortal with immortality, then the saying that is written will come true: "<u>Death has been</u> <u>swallowed up in victory</u>."

I know people that to the world and naturally to themselves -

- Think they are worthless, and without point or purpose,
- But to the person *who is in Christ* their life *has not ended* but broadened.
- No matter <u>who you are</u> or <u>what your circumstances are</u>.

**Because he lives! - John 16:33 - <sup>33</sup>** "I have told you these things, so that in me you may have peace. In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world."

**Every crisis and every circumstance - Romans 8:28 -** <sup>28</sup> And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, <u>who have been</u> <u>called according to his purpose</u>.

## Christ saw your problem and your circumstance from the foundation of the world

- He's already walked your road and your path...
- *<u>He made the way</u>* so you don't have to do anything <u>but follow his steps</u>.

# A Resurrected Life - BAPTISM

1 Corinthians 15:20-22 - <sup>20</sup> But Christ has indeed been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep. <sup>21</sup> For since death came through a man, the resurrection of the dead comes also through a man. <sup>22</sup> For as in Adam all die, so in Christ all will be made alive.

# <u>3 Things</u>

Death – There is death in all our lives

- Our sin
- Our failures
- Our shortcomings
- Our pasts
- The dead places in our lives

## The grave – Where you put your dead stuff

- That is what baptism is all about
- There is *a place to put some of the dead* places of our lives.
- You do put <u>dead stuff</u> in a grave.
- Someone said to me last night, "I have too much bitterness in my heart.
- I don't think I can be saved."
- Can I say, that's what the altar if for.
- That what baptism is all about.
- There is a place to put all that dead stuff.

# The resurrection - Just because something looks dead to you does not mean that God cannot resurrect it.

- Jesus told them, destroy this temple and in 3 days <u>I will raise it up</u>.
- It may look like a lost cause to you...
- It may **feel like there is no hope** to you...
- <u>No one</u> else <u>may have any faith</u> for it,
- But let Jesus touch it and heal it and it will become resurrected!

Here's what I am saying.

- That the <u>dead stuff in your life</u> can be buried today.
- You can <u>put it where it belongs</u>.
- You can say, *"I'm done carrying this dead stuff* around all my life!"
- All you really have to do is <u>make up your mind</u> that <u>you are ready for Jesus</u> to resurrect it.

Romans 6:4 - <sup>4</sup> We were therefore buried with him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life.

You see a resurrected life is a life that has been touched by God's grace and His miraculous power.

You can have a resurrected life!

- You can *live above the dead stuff* in your life.
- You don't have to be *defined by your mistakes*.
- You **don't have to be** *defined by your failures*.
- There can be <u>a resurrection in you today</u>.
- Something can come alive that has been dead for a long time.
