Dads are a Big Deal...

1 Corinthians 11:3 - NKJV

³ But I want you to know that the head of every man is Christ, the head of woman *is* man, and the head of Christ *is* God.

Fathers sometimes get a bad rap.

Churches sometimes spend <u>Mother's Day bragging</u> on Mom and <u>Father's Day</u> beating up on Dad.

One small boy said,

"Father's Day is just like Mother's Day, only you don't spend as much on the gift." May I speak for fathers everywhere when I say, "What gift?"

Mark Twain said,

"When I was a boy of 14 my father was so ignorant I could hardly stand to have the old man around. But when I got to 21, I was astonished at how much the old man learned in 7 years."

There are sayings we associate with our dads.

Here are the top ten **Dad quotes** from the article - - -

"The World According To Fathers" ...

- 1. What part of "no" don't you understand?
- 2. This is going to **hurt me** more than it hurts you.
- 3. Why? Because I said so!
- 4. I wasn't asleep; I was just resting my eyes.
- 5. Shut the door; were you born in a barn?
- 6. A little **dirt never hurt** anyone.
- 7. As long as you *live under my roof*, you'll live by my rules.

- 8. I'm not made out of money.
- 9. Don't make me stop this car!
- 10. Ask your mother.

Jewish tradition insists that fatherhood is not necessarily biological.

• The one who raises a child is considered the true parent.

Teachers are like fathers,

Where the father is only <u>a biological</u> relationship

<u>It is the teacher</u> who provides <u>what a father should</u> provide: <u>guidance</u>, <u>values</u>, <u>discipline</u>, <u>direction</u> and <u>love</u>.

In the first century, families were presided over by fathers who could do whatever they pleased in their homes.

- Rome had a law called "the father's power."
- Men who were Roman citizens were given absolute rights over their families.

By law- - -

- The children and the wife
- Were regarded as <u>the patriarch's personal property</u>
- And he could do with them what he wished.

A displeased father could

- <u>Disown</u> his children - -
- Sell them into slavery - -
- Or even <u>kill</u> them if he wished.

When a child was born, the baby was placed between the father's feet.

- If the father **picked up the baby**, the child <u>stayed in the home</u>.
- If he turned and walked away - -
- The child was either <u>left to die</u> or <u>sold at auction</u>.

Seneca, a contemporary of the apostle Paul, described Roman policy with regard

to <u>unwanted animals</u>:

"We slaughter a fierce ox; we strangle a mad dog; we plunge a knife into a sick cow. Children born weak or deformed we drown."

Things are not much better today, are they?

Millions of unwanted babies are aborted each year.

Children have become a disposable commodity in our society, just as they were in Rome!

But the Bible calls *Christian fathers* to a different standard!

Our kids are not property to own

• But *image bearers of God* who <u>need to be trained</u>.

Dads, we are called to - - Provide a proper <u>nurturing environment</u> - Where our kids can grow up **To love and serve the Lord!!!!!!**

The <u>New Testament</u> challenges us to see the word "father" <u>as a verb not just a noun.</u>

A verb is a word that <u>expresses an action</u> or a state of being.

Fathers need to action!!!!

• A noun is a word used to <u>name a person</u>, animal, place, thing, and abstract idea.

Fathers are more than a name!!!!!!

It's biologically easy to become a father - - -

• But <u>biblically challenging</u> to actually "<u>father" our children</u>.

The Bible very clearly challenges dads - - -

- To be the spiritual leader in their homes - -
- The ultimate responsibility for what a family becomes - -
- Belongs to the father!!!!!!!!

The primary part of that responsibility - - - Is striking a balance between **LOVE and DISCIPLINE**.

Hebrews 12:7 – NIV

Endure hardship as discipline; God is treating you as his children. For **what children are not disciplined** by their father?

Who loves his child more, the one who corrects or the one that allows wrong?

God <u>corrects and disciplines</u> because of <u>His deep love for us</u>.

1 Thessalonians 2:11 - NIV

- ¹¹ For you **know that we dealt with** each of you as a father deals with his own children,
 - No loving Father would <u>neglect the safety</u> of his children,
 - Allowing circumstances That may be harmful or fatal!!!!!!

Ephesians 6:4 - NIV

- ⁴ Fathers, (or parents) <u>do not exasperate</u> your children; instead, bring them up in the training and instruction of the Lord.
 - We do not want to <u>discourage</u> our children - But, raise them in a <u>Christ</u> honoring manner!

Colossians 3:21 - NIV

- ²¹ Fathers, (Or parents) <u>do not embitter</u> your children, or they will become discouraged.
 - Children need firm discipline administered in love.

In writing to the Corinthians - - -

- Paul compares his <u>role as an apostle</u> to the <u>role filled by a dad</u>.
- No one can take the unique place of dad!

1 Corinthians 4:15 - NIV

¹⁵ Even if you had ten thousand guardians in Christ, **you do not have many fathers**, for in Christ Jesus I became your father through the gospel.

Paul was saying here that he was the founder of the church

- Paul's tough words were <u>motivated by love</u> –
- <u>Like the love</u> **a good father** has for his children.

One of the biggest threats to the generation we are now raising - - - Is the breakdown of the family.

<u>Lifelong marriages</u> **provide the foundation for social order**; <u>everything of value</u> rest on those underpinnings.

<u>Historically</u>, when the family begins to unravel in any culture, everything else is adversely affected.

70% of black babies and 20% of white babies born in North America are **born out** of wedlock.

• Most of them will never know their fathers – or a father's love.

<u>Only 1/3 of children born in North America</u> will live with <u>both biological parents</u> through age 18.

How does this affect us?

85% of children with behavior disorders are from fatherless homes

71% of <u>high school drop outs</u> are from fatherless homes

70% of *teen pregnancies* are from fatherless homes

80% of *rapists* are from fatherless homes

75% of teen patients in drug abuse centers are from fatherless homes

70% of *juveniles in correctional institutions* are from fatherless homes

85% of *youths in prison* are from fatherless homes

63% of *youth suicides* are from fatherless homes

Thirty years ago, we believed that poverty and racial discrimination were

primarily responsible for juvenile crime and behavioral problems.

Now, nearly all of the evidence points to <u>family breakup as the real culprit</u>, and <u>predicts a societal catastrophe</u> if we <u>don't</u> turn this trend around!

72% of North Americans say <u>the physical absence</u> of fathers is the <u>most serious problem facing our families.</u>

How can you buck the trend?

By committing your life totally to Christ and <u>raising your family to do the same!</u>

Christian fathers - do not lie, steal, lust and covet!

- do not serve the god of money!
- **do not** father and then abandon their children!
- **do not** cheat on their wives!
- don't send their kids to church, they take them!
- have a REAL relationship with God!!!!!!!!!

The <u>greatest need</u> of the hour is <u>united homes</u> where <u>Christ is exalted!</u>

Many of you were raised in homes where this was **NOT** the case - - -

 The Bible has special value for you since it shows us an IDEAL father – <u>God</u> <u>Himself</u>!

Matthew 7:9-11 - NIV

⁹ "Which of you, if your son asks for bread, will give him a stone? ¹⁰ Or if he asks for a fish, will give him a snake?

¹¹ If you, then, **though you are evil**, <u>know how to give good gifts to your children</u>, **how much more** will your Father in heaven give good gifts to those who ask him!

As we learn to know God better as a loving father, we <u>learn to ask for what is</u> good for us, he then grants it!

Many miss the fact that we must 1st be born again to receive God's blessings.

John 15:7 - NIV

⁷ If you remain <u>in me</u> and my words remain <u>in you</u>, **ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you.**

- Apart from Christ our efforts are unfruitful.
- Are you receiving the <u>nourishment and life</u> **offered by Christ?**

Galatians 4:6-7 - NIV

⁶ **Because you are his sons**, God sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts, the Spirit who calls out, "Abba, Father."

⁷So you are no longer a slave, **but God's child;** and since you are his child, **God has made you also an heir.**

As God's heirs – we learn to ask for what is good for us, he then grants it!

- We can claim what he has provided for us –
- Our full identity as His children!

The Story of Jairus - Mark 5:22-24 - Mark 5:35-42

- 1. He was the father of a young daughter.
- 2. His daughter was in urgent need, due to a severe illness.
- 3. **He pleaded earnestly** for her to Jesus.
- 4. He exhibited great faith on her behalf, Mark 5:40
- 5. Jesus answered by miraculously raising the girl from the dead.

Jairus's crisis made him feel confused, afraid, and without hope.

- Jesus' words to Jairus in the midst of crisis speaks to us as well,
- "Don't be afraid, Just Believe."

The Story of the Father of a Deaf-Mute, Epileptic Son, Mark 9:17-27

- 1. His son was in great need.
- 2. The father had faith to come to Jesus and His disciples.
- 3. **That** <u>faith was initially disappointed</u> because the disciples could not do anything.
- 4. Even so, the father asked for an increase of faith, Mark 9:23-24.
- 5. Jesus answered by miraculously healing the son.

Jesus meant here that anything is possible if we believe - - - Because nothing is too difficult for God.

Closing:

Growing in faith is a constant process of daily renewing **our trust in Jesus**.

Fathers it is time to Appeal!!!!!!!!

- 1. **Fathers:** It is time to believe God for your family and intercede for your family.
- 2. **Everyone:** it is time

If you have faith, God will work in your life.

If you think <u>you are lacking in faith</u>, call out to the Lord anyway and <u>ask Him to increase your faith</u>.

We must continue to <u>trust God</u> because, in time, <u>He will fulfill all His promises!</u>
