Relationships Part Eight - Our Children

Today is our final lesson on the topic of relationships. But also one of the most important....my topic today is **Raising Children**!

I want to read *four verses* from the scripture....

Titus 2:4 - ⁴ Then they can urge the younger women to love their husbands and children,

Ephesians 6:4 - ⁴ And you, fathers, do not provoke your children to wrath, but bring them up in the training and admonition of the Lord.

Proverbs 22:6 - ⁶ Train up a child in the way he should go, and when he is old he will not depart from it.

Proverbs 13:24 - ²⁴ He who spares his rod hates his son, But he who loves him disciplines him promptly.

There is **no greater honor or privilege** in life than bringing <u>a brand-new bouncing</u> <u>baby into this world</u>, then trying to raise them up over the next twenty years...

Doing so will require <u>all or your intelligence</u>, <u>all your patience</u>, <u>all of your</u> <u>determination</u>!

I realize that *this topic cannot be taught in great depth today*, so understand that I am just scratching the surface.

These verses give us *four basic principles* the Bible teaches about raising *children*....

- 1. We are to **love them**.
- 2. We are to **nurture them**.
- 3. We are to **admonish** and **train them**.
- 4. We are to **discipline** them **in love**.

I am not an expert....

I am still learning every day...but the first and <u>the most important thing</u> that I can tell you...is to make sure you <u>raise your children in Love</u>.

Love them with everything you have...Love them with all <u>your heart</u>, and all <u>your</u> <u>soul</u>!

You are going to **make some mistakes** in raising your kids....but at least <u>make your</u> <u>mistakes out of love</u>.

You are going to **make some mistakes** in disciplining your kids....at least <u>discipline</u> <u>them out of love</u>!

If you mess up, always do it on the side of love!

Raising kids may seem easy when you have only one.

Some of you parents are in for <u>a rude awakening</u>! I know from <u>my experience</u>.

It all starts out cozy and cuddly and cute....

- Our first little one was an angel.... she was made out of <u>sugar and spice and</u> <u>everything nice</u>!
- She was the center of attention.... the center or our world...spoiled silly.
- Even the boys start out that way.... but it isn't very long till you find out that the boys *are not made out of sugar and spice*.... they are made out of <u>snakes</u>, and <u>snails</u>, and <u>puppy dog tails</u>.

When one little angel turns into <u>three or four screaming kids</u>.... things can change very quickly.

Love is replaced by frustration, frustration by fear, and fear by anger.

Kids can make you mad...really, really mad!

When that happens....

- Make a *quick exit* out of the room
- Take a couple of *deep breaths* and *remember* how much **you love them**
- Then come back and **discipline them**.

Do not discipline out of anger.... Discipline out of love!

- The Bible says, "Provoke not your children to wrath!"
- Love them in *all* that you do!

The Bible says to nurture them!

<u>The Greek word is paideia</u>, which means to tutor, train, and educate them! (Pai.day.uh) – Education or Upbringing.

It is *the responsibility of the parents* to train their children.

- **Do not leave this up to** <u>the schools</u>.
- Do not leave this up to <u>society</u>.
- Don't leave it up to <u>Sunday School</u>.
- o It is up <u>to you</u>!

I am <u>not saying</u> that you have to home school your children.

But you do have train them up in *the nurture and admonition of God*!

The word *admonition means* 'calling attention to!'

You will be <u>one of the few people in their life</u> **that call their attention to** <u>the ways</u> <u>of God</u>!

- That means instilling *the right values* in them.... Godly values!
- The schools are not going to train them *in Godly values*!

We teach and train them in the ways of God <u>because</u> we want them to make it to heaven!

- We read them *Bible stories*.
- We have *devotion*.
- We *pray with them* every day!
- We do everything that we can do ... and then ...
 - We make sure they are *in Sunday School*.
 - We make sure they are <u>at youth service</u>....camp meetings....youth rallies...outreach!
 - **Nobody else** is going to do that *but you*!
 - It is *your responsibility*!

The Bible says....

Proverbs 22:6 - ⁶ Train up a child in the way he should go, and <u>when he is old he</u> <u>will not depart</u> from it.

Some of you may have children that are not living according to God's word!

• I did everything that I could Lord, why are they <u>not living for you Lord</u>?

I can't answer that...but *notice* what the scripture says....

It says when he is <u>old</u>...he will <u>not</u> depart!

• It doesn't say when he's a teenager. he will not depart. but when he is old!

You may do everything <u>that you know to do</u>, and your children may still **leave the faith....** but **the Bible says**, <u>when he is old...he is coming back</u>!

There will come a day in their life when <u>all your nurturing</u> and <u>all your teaching</u> will pay off...they will remember...

• <u>Don't</u> ever give up hope!

Don't be so heavenly minded with your kids, that they are no earthly good!

- Give them some <u>life skills</u>!
- Train them up to be *responsible and contributing* members of society!
- Make sure they get a job when they are old enough.
- Have a <u>college fund</u> set aside for them.
- Let them get <u>an education</u>.
- Have some faith that <u>God can use them</u> in a powerful way!

There is nothing more powerful in this world than an educated, Holy Spirit filled and anointed young person.

- That young person <u>can answer some of the hard questions</u> that this society has about God.
- We need *educated young people* more than we ever have before!

We need to **trust God** in this area...*His Spirit* is more than able to keep them.

• I <u>can't</u> tell you how many times <u>God's Spirit kept me from</u> doing some things I shouldn't have even thought about!

If you believe God's Spirit can still keep our young people...clap your hands!

<u>Discipline</u> - The golden rule here is to <u>discipline your children out of love</u>! When you <u>discipline</u> your kids...discipline them with <u>a spiritual mindset</u>.

- In other words, *teach repentance*.
- Teach forgiveness Teach humility Teach respect.
- Put a premium on <u>honesty</u> and <u>accountability</u>.
- Pray with your children *immediately* after you discipline them.
- *Reassure them of* your love and of *God's love*!

God made you *the head of your house* for a reason....to raise your kids right!

You *are* the authority!

Studies show that the <u>past few generations</u> have grown to **dislike authority**, and because of that, **parents** <u>do not</u> <u>want to become an authority figure</u> to their kids for <u>fear</u> their kids will grow up **hating them**.

So instead of being <u>the dad</u>...they are <u>best buddies</u>! Instead of being <u>the mom</u>...they are <u>gal pals</u>!

- Please understand that *<u>I am talking in general terms</u>* today...this couldn't be happening in our church.
- What we have today is <u>a generation of young people</u> that <u>do not</u> understand authority!

It is **common today** for parents to raise their kids by *asking them questions*...

- Do you want to eat broccoli for supper?
- Would you like to go to bed now?
- Don't you think it is time to eat supper?
- Wouldn't it be a good idea to do your homework?

Don't be <u>tentative</u> with your children, <u>replace those question marks</u> with exclamation points!

- Eat your broccoli!
- It is time to go to bed!
- Do your homework, now!

God made you the head of your house.... you need to use that authority!

The reason that **God made you the authority** is <u>because you know better</u> than they do about what is right and what is wrong!

The Apostle Paul said.... 1 Corinthians 14:8 – ⁸ For if the trumpet makes <u>an uncertain sound</u>, who will prepare for battle?

Children are hearing an uncertain sound today!

We <u>cannot</u> be uncertain in raising our kids, we must be <u>firm and in control</u>!

If parents keep sending that uncertain sound.... <u>their children will not</u> be ready to make it on their own!

Believe it or not your <u>children want discipline</u>.

A seventh-grade teacher in Oregon recently took a vote in her class. Her question was, "Raise your hand if you want rules and you want your parents to enforce them."

- To her surprise, over *two thirds of her class* raised their hands.
- One of the things that surprised her the most was that the coolest kid in the class raised his hand and began to speak about wanting rules.'
- He wanted rules and *resented his parents for not* disciplining him.
- He felt that *they didn't care* enough about him *to discipline him*!

Kids are <u>not</u> dumb.... they know <u>when you don't care</u>.

Rules and discipline make kids feel loved and secure...so be firm, be certain!

<u>When</u> you make up <u>a set of rules</u>.... base them on <u>the word of God</u> and <u>let your</u> <u>children know</u> that <u>they are also God's rules</u>!

Explain the rules in advance and *explain the penalty* for breaking the rules.

This is the certain sound I was talking about a few minutes ago!

- Then follow through with discipline!
- **Do not threaten discipline** *without following through*.... children learn when you are bluffing.
- Your actions must be **<u>consistent</u> with your word**.

Discipline fairly!

- **Do not** discipline without having <u>all the facts</u>.
- Your kids will *hold it against you* if you discipline them without reason.

So, before you discipline... <u>get the facts right</u> and let the punishment meet the crime!

- <u>Uppercuts</u> to the nose are never acceptable!
- I don't know if having your kid go *cut their own switches*.
- **Don't** <u>spank your kids for accidents</u>...they are kids, they have accidents!
- Spilt milk, and broken dishes are just going to be a part of your life!
- That is part of parenting!

Now that I am on this topic. Yes, *pastor believes in spanking*...it is in the Bible!

The Bible says...

Proverbs 22:15 - ¹⁵ Foolishness *is* bound up in the heart of a child; The rod of correction will drive it far from him.

Prov 23:13-14 - 13 Don't be afraid to <u>correct</u> your young ones; *a spanking* won't kill them. 14 *A good spanking*, in fact, might <u>save them from</u> something worse than death.

Make sure you follow the discipline by genuine expressions of love!

- I am thankful today because I had parents who cared enough about me <u>to</u> <u>discipline me in love</u>!
- I don't know where I would be today *without that discipline*!

In closing I want to speak for just a few moments today about Uncles, Aunts, and Grandparents!

If I could *use one word to describe what* <u>Grandparents</u>, <u>Aunts</u>, and <u>Uncles</u> do in raising your children *I would use the word* <u>supplement</u> or <u>maybe support</u>.

Grandparents do not replace a parent's authority, but they support it.

- If the parents are present...<u>the **parents**</u> are the authority.
- If not...*the grandparents will reinforce* what the parents have taught!

My grandparents, I often spent time with them on weekends and summer.

<u>I thought</u> I would be given anything that I wanted whenever I wanted it...and my brother and sister would be stuck with mom and dad at home!

It was going to be heaven!

The first couple of times were kind of like that.

- But then I had a rude awakening.
- Pap was building a garage, and needed a little helper.... guess who that was.... <u>that was me</u>!
- I mixed mud for laying block I carried the blocks I learned to lay the blocks I cleaned the tools And I learned just where **my dad got his work ethic from**.

I had fun doing it because I was with my Pap, and I had him all to myself!

You see children <u>don't</u> put up the <u>same defenses with their grandparents</u> as they do with their parents, and they are <u>more open to a grandparent's</u> <u>influence</u>.

As Grandparents, and as Aunts and Uncles to some extent, you need to understand that <u>you have this awesome and unique opportunity</u> to make a profound impact on your grandchildren!

- They are so open to what you have to say!
- Spoil them yes...but take it a step further and <u>support your own children</u> in raising your grandchildren up <u>in the admonition of God</u>!

One of the most powerful influences in my life was <u>the time I spent with my</u> <u>grandparents</u> as a boy.

I can't put into words *how much that impacted my life*!

- Each day you have with your kids is an opportunity to profoundly impact this world.
- Jesus is watching today; they are so precious is His sight...let's not take this lightly...*our children are the future!*
