Outside The Box Series - Outside The Box Spirit Led and Spirit Filled Church

<u>Outside The Box</u> – 1st Church - Tradition has a way of holding you to your past, which some people love. <u>But it also has a way of limiting your future.</u>

2nd Evangelism - Observers or Participants?

3rd Friendships - That have the strongest relationships, have probably been though a few things together. We have a friend in Jesus!

4th Great Grace - only comes after *Great Mistake*

5th Outside The Box <u>Worship</u> - Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God whatever the cost, "I'm going to worship God"

John 7:37-39 – KJV - ³⁷ In the last day, that great day of the feast, Jesus stood and cried, saying, If any man thirst, let him come unto me, and drink. ³⁸ He that believeth on me, as the scripture hath said, out of his belly shall flow rivers of living water. ³⁹ (But this spake he of the Spirit, which they that believe on him should receive: for the Holy Ghost was not yet given; because that Jesus was not yet glorified.)

John 7:37 – NKJV - <u>The Promise of the Holy Spirit</u> - On the last day, that great day of the feast, Jesus stood and cried out, saying, "If anyone thirsts, let him come to Me and drink. ³⁸ He who believes in Me, as the Scripture has said, <u>out of his heart will flow rivers of living water</u>." ³⁹ But this He spoke concerning the Spirit, whom those believing in Him would receive; for the Holy Spirit was not yet given, because Jesus was not yet glorified.

John 7:37 – CEV - <u>Streams of Life-Giving Water</u> - On the last and most important day of the festival, Jesus stood up and shouted, "If you are thirsty, come to me and drink! ³⁸Have faith in me, and you will have <u>life-giving water flowing from</u> <u>deep inside you</u>, just as the Scriptures say." ³⁹Jesus was talking about the Holy <u>Spirit</u>, who would be given to everyone that had faith in him. The Spirit had not yet been given to anyone, since Jesus had not yet been given his full glory This bold statement of Jesus promises to the believers an experience that is nothing like anything they have ever heard or seen before.

- "Out of their belly shall flow rivers of Living Water." KJV
- *"Out of his heart will flow rivers of living water." NKJV*
- *"Life-giving water flowing from deep inside you." CEV*

Jesus used *living water* in 4:10 to indicate *eternal life*.

• Here He used the term to refer to *the Holy Spirit*.

<u>The two go together</u>: Wherever the <u>Holy Spirit is accepted</u>, He brings <u>eternal</u> <u>life</u>!

<u>The setting for this statement</u> is <u>a feast</u> that would end the Jewish Festival of Tabernacles where many people have come <u>ready to eat</u>.

- They have *traveled from far away* to come to this feast.
- They are **hungry**. They are **thirsty**.
- They are ready to sit down and fill their hungry bellies with whatever the host has provided for them.

Jesus, understanding that <u>the guests are hungry</u> and ready to drink and eat, stands up and shouts to the people –

<u>The Promise of the Holy Spirit</u> - On the last day, that great day of the feast, Jesus stood and cried out, saying, "If anyone thirsts, let <u>him come to Me and drink</u>!"

<u>Come to me and drink</u> – Alluded to the theme of many Bible passages that talk about <u>the Messiah's life-giving blessings</u>.

In promising to give the Holy Spirit to all who believed in him, Jesus was claiming to be the Messiah, for that was something <u>only</u> the Messiah could do.

- Jesus extends this open invitation to everyone today.
- Come to Him and accept *his deeply satisfying love* for you...

³⁸ He that believeth on me, as the scripture hath said, out of his belly shall flow rivers of living water.

I'm sure many people thought he was strange. But <u>many who comprehended</u> <u>what He was promising</u> understood that He was offering them something <u>much</u> <u>better</u> than what the Great Feast <u>was going to provide</u>.

- The feast was **important**. The feast was well **prepared**.
- The feast was **rehearsed.** The feast was **expensive**.
- The feast was what everyone **<u>expected</u>**.
- The feast was tradition. The feast was Great!

Jesus stands up and cries out to the people, "I've got something much better than this prepared for you!"

<u>He let them know</u> that there was <u>coming</u> something that <u>no level of expertise</u>, or <u>preparation</u> or <u>rehearsal</u> or <u>expense</u> or <u>tradition</u> could ever substitute for.

There was coming something that was *ginormous* if you will.

- It was something that **no glass of water** could compete with.
- He likened it to not just a nice glass of cold refreshing water, but
- <u>He said</u> it is like <u>a River of Living</u> (Eternity) <u>water</u>.
- <u>He said</u>, "what I have <u>to offer you</u> will not just keep you <u>alive and refreshed</u> for a day or two, but
- <u>He said</u>, This <u>living</u> water <u>will be alive inside of you</u> and <u>will flow out of</u> <u>you</u>."
- "There will be <u>no holding</u> this thing in,"
- <u>He said</u>, "It will <u>flow out</u> of you <u>whether you want it to or not</u>.
- It will flow out of you <u>when you want it to</u> and <u>when you are not</u> <u>expecting</u> it to."
- *<u>He said</u>*, "*<u>It's like a river</u>*. It will be *<u>continuous</u>, <u>constant</u>, <u>relentless</u>...*

³⁹ But this <u>He spoke concerning the Spirit</u>, whom those believing in Him would receive; for <u>the Holy Spirit was not yet given</u>, <u>because</u> Jesus was not yet glorified.

Now <u>verse 39 tells us</u> - He's <u>not</u> really <u>talking about water</u> per say, but rather He's talking about <u>the Holy Spirit Infilling</u>.

I want to talk to you about the Spirit Filled and Spirit Led Church.

Here's a question for you - How can a person talk about something that they have never experienced before?

- How could you be <u>a successful salesperson of a product</u> you yourself have never tried?
- How can a church <u>talk about and promise to the world</u> the help of the Holy Spirit *if in fact it is not a* Spirit Filled and Spirit Led Church?

Church <u>must</u> be more than something that is <u>important to do on a Sunday</u>.

It must be <u>more than</u> well prepared.

- It must be more than rehearsed, expensive, and more than expected.
- It should **never be tradition**.
- I believe <u>My Church</u> needs to be **Spirit Filled and Spirit Led**.
- I believe <u>My Church</u> needs to be a place where the Holy Spirit of God <u>has</u> <u>free reign to operate and manifest</u>.

I <u>don't</u> know about you, but I am after <u>more than a social gathering</u> here today.

- I am not a *good enough speaker* to captivate you with my Words.
- I am <u>completely dependent upon</u> the Spirit of God for the words that <u>I</u> share with you.

This church is <u>prepared</u>. We are <u>rehearsed</u>, we do <u>aim for excellence</u> in all that we do,

- But *beyond that*, On top of *all of that*, more important *than all of that*,
- What you should expect beyond <u>all the work</u>, <u>rehearsal</u>, <u>expense</u>, and <u>preparedness</u> is <u>for God to show up</u>!

<u>Without His touch</u> on this service, we're <u>just another</u> nice place to gather to worship on Sunday morning.

We've been talking about *the church that is Outside the Box*!

If we're going to be <u>a boxed church</u>, then <u>we don't need to</u> talk about <u>John 7:38</u>.

If we are going to be a church that is <u>Outside The Box</u>,

- Then we are going to **<u>need</u>** His help getting there -
- And the key to becoming an Outside The Box Church is found in John 7:38!

We must be willing and able to <u>allow the Holy Spirit</u> to <u>flow through us as</u> <u>individuals</u> and <u>as a corporate church</u>.

Realize My Church <u>will never become</u> a Spirit Filled and Spirit Led Church <u>until</u> you and I as individuals become <u>Spirit Filled</u> and <u>Spirit Led</u>.

Can I ask, "<u>Why Not</u>?" - People want to make up <u>all kinds of excuses and</u> <u>reasons</u> why we should not get too carried away in church.

- They want to keep everyone quiet.
- They want to tell us all to **settle down**!

<u>Why</u>? - Church is not <u>a mortuary</u>. Church is not <u>funeral home</u>.

Church is a place where <u>the Holy Spirit is supposed to have free reign</u> and <u>opportunity</u> to touch lives that are <u>hurting and who need ministered to</u>.

- There is **no** form here. There is **no** fashion here.
- We have **no** real program.
- We are ready at any moment <u>to stop whatever we are doing</u> and <u>allow</u> <u>God to work</u> and minister to people.
- We are not *led by the clock* or *the program here*.
- The Spirit leads us!

There is only one requirement for us as a church and as individuals: to become a Spirit Filled and Spirit Led Church...

Jesus stood and cried, saying, If any man thirst, let him come unto me, and drink. ³⁸ He that believeth on me, as the scripture hath said, out of his belly shall flow rivers of living water.

We have to want it!

- We have to be thirsty for it!
- It has to be **what we desire** when we come to church!
- We can't be <u>nonchalant</u> about it.
- We can't be <u>careless</u> about it.
- We have to want it!

Listen, I appreciate all of you <u>who work so hard to minister to the church</u> on Sunday.

I appreciate <u>our</u> singers, <u>sound technician</u>, <u>children's pastors</u> for what they are doing, **Thank you!**

But Can I say <u>if we don't have</u> the touch of God and <u>the moving of His Spirit</u> upon all that we do, <u>we are missing out</u> on an amazing opportunity around here.

CLOSE:

God wants to <u>meet us</u> here.

- Jesus wants to *touch lives*.
- The Holy Spirit wants to *fill somebody today*.
- We say we are a church where <u>Real Needs Are Met</u> and <u>where Lives Are</u> <u>Transformed</u>,

Listen you and I <u>cannot</u> do that... <u>Only</u> Jesus can do that!

I have no ability to <u>transform</u> anything, but <u>Jesus can</u>, and <u>He will if</u> we as a congregation will <u>only become</u> Spirit Filled and Spirit Led!

<u>Church</u> is a place where <u>the Holy Spirit is supposed to have free reign</u> and <u>opportunity to touch lives</u> that are <u>hurting</u> and <u>who need ministered to</u>.

Jesus stands up and cries out to the people, "I've got something much better than this prepared for you!"
