#### Outside The Box Worship - The Philippian Jailer Saved

Acts 16:25-26 NKJV - - <sup>25</sup> But at midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God, and the prisoners were listening to them. <sup>26</sup> Suddenly there was a great earthquake, so that the foundations of the prison were shaken; and immediately all the doors were opened, and everyone's chains were loosed.

Acts 16:25-26 CEV - <sup>25</sup> About midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing praises to God, while the other prisoners listened. <sup>26</sup> Suddenly a strong earthquake shook the jail to its foundations. The doors opened, and the chains fell from all the prisoners.

#### The Box = Self-Preservation – Pride – Arrogance - Tradition

I find it strange sometimes that <u>New Converts</u> are often more outward worshippers than <u>established church people</u>.

<u>You would think</u> that it would be <u>the other way around</u> as people, who have been **forgiven, redeemed, blessed** should have <u>more reason to worship Him</u>.

But something happens when people "sit" in church.

Someone who has *just been baptized or filled with the Holy Spirit* does not usually have these problems as they have no walls.

# The world we live in <u>does not</u> worship God.

- They unashamedly *worship people*.
- They worship *football and baseball* and *Basketball* teams.
- They worship *Nascar Drivers*.
- They worship *boxers*.
- They worship *movie stars*.

<u>They fill stadiums</u> with tens of thousands of people who yell and scream to the top of their lungs to cheer their favorite team on, **but when it comes to church and God,** these same people become <u>silent and timid</u> about <u>lifting their voice in</u> <u>worship to Him</u>.

• They seem **<u>ashamed</u>** for some reason <u>**to Worship Him**</u>.

<u>They'll talk to their friends</u> about just about anything <u>when it comes to the latest</u> <u>ball games</u> or <u>TV shows</u> or <u>Music Concert</u> they have been to, **but when it <u>comes to</u>** <u>Jesus</u>... they get too <u>embarrassed to talk</u>.

**Exodus 34:14** - <sup>14</sup> For you shall worship no other god, for the Lord, whose name is Jealous, *is* a jealous God.

### Words like ...

- Excitement Enthusiasm Exhilaration Animation Thrill
- Are words that usually describe the latest sports event, or music concert
- But seldom do they describe <u>the most recent worship service</u> in many churches.

## Why is that? What is it that inhibits us? What is it that keeps us from entering into worship?

### Acts 16:16-26 CEV - Paul and Silas Are Put in Jail

<sup>16</sup> One day on our way to the place of prayer, we were met by a slave girl. She had a spirit in her that gave her the power to tell the future. By doing this she made a lot of money for her owners. <sup>17</sup> The girl followed Paul and the rest of us, and she kept yelling, "These men are servants of the Most High God! They are telling you how to be saved." <sup>18</sup> This went on for several days. Finally, Paul got so upset that he turned and said to the spirit, "In the name of Jesus Christ, I order you to leave this girl alone!" At once the evil spirit left her.

<sup>19</sup> When the girl's owners realized they had lost all chances for making more money, they grabbed Paul and Silas and dragged them into court. <sup>20</sup> They told the officials, "These Jews are upsetting our city! <sup>21</sup> They are telling us to do things we Romans are not allowed to do."

<sup>22</sup> The crowd joined in the attack on Paul and Silas. Then the officials tore the clothes off the two men and ordered them to be beaten with a whip. <sup>23</sup> After they had been badly beaten, they were put in jail, and the jailer was told to guard them carefully. <sup>24</sup> The jailer did as he was told. He put them deep inside the jail and chained their feet to heavy blocks of wood.

**The Philippian Jailer Saved** - <sup>25</sup> About midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing praises to God, while the other prisoners listened. <sup>26</sup> Suddenly a strong earthquake shook the jail to its foundations. The doors opened, and the chains fell from all the prisoners.

### You don't know who your worship will set free...

- There are *people who come in here* **bound up** *by the afflictions of their life* and **they need to hear** *Paul and Silas worship*.
- They *need to know* that *deliverance is available* to them!

### Paul and Silas took their praise and worship outside the Box.

- They *understood* the box.
- They were <u>tied to</u> the box.
- They were *<u>chained</u>* to the box.
- Their box was **built** <u>to contain them</u>.
- Their box was **designed** to keep them in.
- **<u>But</u>** their **Praise and their Worship** <u>took them outside</u> the box.

# I don't know what labels <u>are on the walls of your Box</u> today, but <u>you need to</u> <u>know</u> that <u>you don't have to</u> keep your worship inside the box.

- Understand something, God loves Praise.
- He loves to be worshipped.

**Psalm 22:3** - 3 But You are holy, Enthroned in the praises of Israel.

Here is the reason Paul and Silas were able to break out of the Roman Jail.

- Their God could not be constrained.
- He is a God who is *bigger than their situation*.
- He is stronger than the enemy who sought to destroy them.
- The scriptures tell us that <u>the Earth is the Lords</u> and <u>the fullness</u> <u>thereof</u>,
- So... that little Roman jail was not <u>big enough</u> or <u>strong enough</u> to hold them in <u>once they started praising</u> Him.

But You are holy, Enthroned in the praises of Israel.

- Little bitty *jail cell*...*Great Big God!!!*
- Little bitty <u>Box</u>...Great Big God!!!
- Little bitty *situation*...*Great Big God!*

# Your situation <u>is not</u> nearly as big as the God that we worship around here.

Paul and Silas found out that Praise and Worship – Has the tendency to

- **Release you** from whatever it is *the enemy has built around you*.
- That's intended to keep you from -
- Experiencing <u>God's delivering power</u>.

I talked a few weeks ago about <u>David</u> and how he brought the Ark of God back into Jerusalem.

How many of you remember how he did it?

- He did it with <u>Worship</u>.
- He did it with *shouts of praise*.
- He did it with *dancing*.
- He didn't care <u>what other people thought</u> of him.
- He didn't care <u>what his relatives</u> thought.

*He <u>lay down</u> is robes of royalty* and <u>went to praising and worshipping</u> the God that he served.

- His God was bigger than other people's expectations of him as king.
- *His <u>God</u> was more worthy* of <u>demonstrative praise</u> rather than <u>what a few</u> <u>others</u> thought of him.

# His praise went outside the box.

- His worship *left the confines of tradition* and *other people's expectations*.
- The only thing <u>that mattered to David was</u> whether <u>God was pleased</u> with his worship.
- Even his wife could not constrain his outburst of praise.

# A church that has Out of the Box worship is an exciting church.

- It's a church that is fun.
- It's a church that has *more than a musical performance*.
- It's a church where <u>the Spirit of God can move</u> and <u>minister</u> to people –
- long <u>before</u> the sermon or altar call.

It's <u>a church where</u> people walk away saying, <u>that was Good</u> Church!

A missionary to Russia told me years ago that <u>the people in the underground</u> <u>churches</u> would have to sit on their hands so that they would not clap them during service.

- If they were caught worshipping God in the service, they would be taken out and shot.
- SO, <u>they would sit on their hands because</u> they knew that when <u>the</u> <u>presence of God</u> came into the room, they would not be <u>able to contain</u> their worship – even at <u>the threat of death</u>.

IF Christianity is the transformation of rebels into worshipers of God

• Then *it is imperative for the Christian to know and understand* what constitutes biblical worship.

# Webster Dictionary's <u>meaning of worship</u> (adore, idolize, esteem worthy, reverence, etc.).

# Defining worship proves difficult because it is both an attitude and an act.

# A biblical concept of worship involves praising God and giving Him glory -

- with our lips and our lives, with our words and our deeds,
- with our physical bodies and our spiritual hearts.

Worship that **pleases God is <u>authentic</u>**, offered with <u>clean hands</u> and a <u>pure heart</u>.

# CLOSE:

*Is anyone here today who has decided that <u>whatever the cost</u>, "I'm going to worship God"?* Whatever people think or say about me –

- "My praise will not stay in the box."
- "I've come to worship the one who delivered me from my sins."

# Are there any <u>David's</u> here today? Is there a <u>Paul or a Silas</u> here today?

I don't know about you, but <u>I believe</u> The King of Kings and <u>the Lord of Lords</u> deserves a whole lot more praise than the latest <u>Super Bowl</u> winner or the latest <u>World series</u> winner or <u>the latest whatever</u>.

- He deserves our praise. He deserves our worship.
- He went to the Cross of Calvary and <u>paid the price for my sin</u> and <u>your sin</u> and <u>for that reason alone</u>; He alone deserves my worship and my praise.

# Out of the Box worship <u>does not</u> just happen in church.

It's <u>all week</u> long.

- It's *in our hearts* when we wake up on Monday.
- It's <u>a song on our lips</u> as we go through our day.
- It's *the prayer we pray* as we **drive to work** or our job.
- It's *attitude towards Springfield* and *our commitment* to our church/city.
- It's our witness to other people.
- lt's <u>our love</u> for each other.
