Story – The Father was correcting his son one day.

The son had gone way out from the house to the Out-House and absolutely hated the Out-House. **The Out-house stood on the edge of a creek!** He got so frustrated having to go there that one day <u>he pushed the Out-house</u> over **into the creek**.

The father came to him the next day and said, "Son, Did you push the Out-House into the creek?"

The son said, "Yes Dad I did it!"

The Father <u>took off his belt to do a little correcting</u>, but **the son complained**, he said <u>DAD</u>, "George Washington told his dad the truth about chopping down the cherry tree!"

That's when <u>the father said</u>, "Yes but George Washingtons father was not in the tree!!!" You get the point; <u>Daddy was in the Out-house</u> when it got pushed over.

The young man had made a bad decision because <u>he didn't understand all the ramifications of **his Choice**.</u>

- We live in a day when choices have to be made.
- We live in a day with a fork in the road.
- When you look all around us, all the chaos and confusion, the lack of clarity and voices coming at us from all different directions.
- It is time for men to make a choice.
- The reality **God is waiting on men** to make a choice.

Our Dads are a Big Deal... - $\frac{1}{1}$ Corinthians $\frac{11:3}{1}$ But I want you to know that the head of every man is Christ, the head of woman is man, and the head of Christ is God.

Fathers sometimes get a bad rap. - Churches sometimes spend <u>Mother's Day bragging</u> on Mom and <u>Father's Day beating</u> up on Dad.

One small boy said, "Father's Day is just like Mother's Day, only you don't spend as much on the gift." May I speak for fathers everywhere when I say, "What gift?"

Mark Twain said, "When I was a boy of 14 my father was so ignorant I could hardly stand to have the old man around. But when I got to 21, I was astonished at how much the old man learned in 7 years."

There are <u>sayings we associate with our dads</u>. The <u>top ten Dad quotes</u> from the article - - - "The World According To Fathers" ...

- 1. What part of "no" don't you understand?
- 2. This is going to hurt me more than it hurts you.
- 3. Why? Because I said so!
- 4. I wasn't asleep; I was just resting my eyes.
- 5. Shut the door; were you born in a barn?
- 6. A little dirt never hurt anyone.
- 7. As long as you *live under my roof*, you'll live by my rules.
- 8. I'm not made out of money.
- 9. Don't make me stop this car!
- 10.Ask your mother.

Jewish tradition insists that fatherhood is not necessarily biological.

The one who raises a child is considered the true parent.

<u>Teachers are like fathers</u>, Where the father is only <u>a biological</u> relationship

It is the teacher who provides what a father should provide: guidance, values, discipline, direction and love.

In the first century, families were presided over by fathers who could do whatever they pleased in their homes.

- Rome had a law called "the father's power."
- Men who were Roman citizens were given absolute rights over their families.

By law- - -

- The children and the wife
- Were regarded as the patriarch's personal property.
- And he could do with them what he wished.

A displeased father could

- Disown his children - -
- <u>Sell</u> them into slavery - -
- Or even kill them if he wished.

When a child was born, the baby was placed between the father's feet.

- If the father **picked up the baby**, the child <u>stayed in the home</u>.
- If he turned and walked away - -
- The child was either left to die or sold at auction.

Seneca, a contemporary of the apostle Paul, described Roman policy with regard to unwanted animals:

"We slaughter a fierce ox; we strangle a mad dog; we plunge a knife into a sick cow. Children born weak or deformed we drown."

Things are *not much better today*, are they?

Millions of unwanted babies are <u>aborted</u> each year.

Children have become a disposable commodity in our society, just as they were in Rome!

But the Bible calls *Christian fathers* to a different standard!

Our kids are not property to own

But image bearers of God who need to be trained.

Dads, we are called to - - Provide a proper <u>nurturing environment</u> - Where our kids can grow up **to love and serve the Lord!!!!!!**

The <u>New Testament</u> challenges us to see the word "father" <u>as a verb not just a noun.</u>

• A verb is a word that expresses an action or a state of being.

Fathers need to take action!!!!

• A noun is a word used to <u>name a person</u>, animal, place, thing, and abstract idea. Fathers are more than a name!!!!!!

It's biologically <u>easy to become a father</u> - - - But <u>biblically challenging</u> to actually <u>"father" our children</u>.

The Bible very clearly challenges dads - - -

- To be the spiritual leader in their homes - -
- The ultimate responsibility for what a family becomes - -
- Belongs to the father!!!!!!!

The primary part of that responsibility is striking a balance between <u>LOVE and</u> DISCIPLINE.

Hebrews 12:7 - NIV

Endure hardship as discipline; God is treating you as his children. For **what children are not disciplined** by their father?

Who loves his child more, the one who corrects or the one that allows wrong?

God corrects and disciplines because of His deep love for us.

1 Thessalonians 2:11 - NIV

- ¹¹ For you **know that we dealt with** each of you as a father deals with his own children,
 - No loving Father would <u>neglect the safety</u> of his children,
 - Allowing circumstances That may be harmful or fatal!!!!!

<u>Ephesians 6:4</u> - ⁴ Fathers, (or parents) <u>do not exasperate</u> your children; instead, bring them up in the *training and instruction of the Lord*.

We do not want to <u>discourage</u> our children - - - But raise them in a <u>Christ</u> <u>honoring manner!</u>

<u>Colossians 3:21</u> - ²¹ Fathers, (Or parents) <u>do not embitter</u> your children, or they will become discouraged.

• **Children need** firm discipline administered in love.

In writing to the Corinthians - - -

- Paul compares his role as an apostle to the role filled by a dad.
- No one can take the unique place of dad!

1 Corinthians 4:15 - NIV

¹⁵ Even if you had ten thousand guardians in Christ, <u>you do not have many</u> **fathers**, for in Christ Jesus I became your father through the gospel.

Paul was saying here that he was the founder of the church.

- Paul's tough words were <u>motivated by love</u> –
- <u>Like the love</u> **a good father** has for his children.

One of the biggest threats to the generation we are now raising - - - Is the breakdown of the family.

<u>Lifelong marriages</u> **provide the foundation for social order**; <u>everything of value</u> rests on those underpinnings.

<u>Historically</u>, when the family begins to unravel in any culture, everything else is adversely affected.

Ephesians 6:1-4 - 6 Children, obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right. ² "Honor your father and mother"—which is the first commandment with a promise— ³ "so that it may go well with you and that you may enjoy long life on the earth."

⁴ Fathers, do not exasperate your children; instead, bring them up in the training and instruction of the Lord.

<u>Fathers Have a responsibility</u> to Love, instruct, and discipline their children in the ways of the Lord.

<u>Thirty years ago</u>, <u>we believed that poverty and racial discrimination</u> were primarily responsible **for juvenile crime and behavioral problems**.

<u>Now</u>, nearly all of the evidence points to <u>family breakup as the real culprit</u>, and <u>predicts a societal catastrophe</u> if we <u>don't</u> turn this trend around!

How can you buck the trend?

By committing your life totally to Christ and raising your family to do the same!

<u>Christian fathers</u> - <u>do not lie, steal, lust and covet!</u>

- do not serve the god of money!
- **do not** father and then abandon their children!
- **do not** cheat on their wives!
- don't send their kids to church, they take them!
- have a REAL relationship with God!!!!!!!!!

The <u>greatest need</u> of the hour is <u>united homes</u> where <u>Christ is exalted!</u>

Many of you were raised in homes where this was **NOT** the case - - -

The Bible shows us an IDEAL father – <u>God Himself!</u>

<u>Matthew 7:9-11</u> - ⁹ "Which of you, if your son asks for bread, will give him a stone? ¹⁰ Or if he asks for a fish, will give him a snake?

¹¹ If you, then, **though you are evil**, <u>know how to give good gifts to your children</u>, **how much more** will your Father in heaven give good gifts to those who ask him!

As we learn to know God better as a loving father, we <u>learn to ask for what is</u> good for us, he then grants it!

Many miss the fact that we must 1st be born again to receive God's blessings.

<u>John 15:7</u> - ⁷ If you remain <u>in me</u> and my words remain <u>in you</u>, *ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you*.

- Apart from Christ our efforts are unfruitful.
- Are you receiving the <u>nourishment and life</u> **offered by Christ?**

<u>Galatians 4:6-7</u> - ⁶ *Because you are his sons*, God sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts, the Spirit who calls out, "*Abba*, Father."

⁷So you are no longer a slave, **but** <u>God's child</u>; and since you are his child, <u>God</u> <u>has</u> made you <u>also an heir</u>.

As God's heirs – we learn to ask for what is good for us, he then grants it!

- We can claim what he has provided for us –
- Our full identity as His children!

The Story of Jairus – Mark 5:22-24 - Mark 5:35-42

- 1. He was the father of a young daughter.
- 2. His daughter was in urgent need, due to a severe illness.
- 3. He pleaded earnestly for her to Jesus.
- 4. He exhibited great faith on her behalf, Mark 5:40
- 5. Jesus answered by miraculously raising the girl from the dead.

Jairus's crisis made him feel confused, afraid, and without hope.

- Jesus' words to Jairus during crisis speaks to us as well,
- "Don't be afraid, Just Believe."

The Story of the Father of a Deaf-Mute, Epileptic Son, Mark 9:17-27

- 1. His son was in great need.
- 2. The father <u>had faith</u> to come to Jesus and His disciples.
- 3. That <u>faith was initially disappointed</u> because the disciples could not do anything.
- 4. Even so, the father **asked for** an increase of faith, Mark 9:23-24.
- 5. Jesus answered by miraculously healing the son.

Jesus meant here that anything is possible if we believe - - -

Because <u>nothing</u> is too difficult for God.

CLOSE:

Growing in faith is a constant process of daily renewing our trust in Jesus.

Fathers it is time to Appeal!!!!!!!!

- 1. **Fathers:** It is time to believe God for your family and intercede for your family.
- 2. Everyone: it is time

If you have faith, God will work in your life.

If you think <u>you are lacking in faith</u>, call out to the Lord anyway and <u>ask Him to</u> increase your faith.

We must continue to trust God because, in time, He will fulfill all His promises!
