Courage to Change

In times of stress, depending upon God requires complete commitment.

David - <u>Psalm 31:24</u> NIV - <u>Be strong</u> and take heart (<u>KJV</u> - <u>Be of good courage</u>), all you who hope in the LORD. - - - (Letting Him believe God's promises.)

Courage is...

- Feeling Fear Yet Choosing to Act encouraging us as believers !!!
- Following Your Heart *for God <u>Strength and courage in our faith</u>!!!*
- Persevering in *the Face of Adversity* <u>Trusting God in difficulties</u>!!!
- Standing Up for What Is Right <u>He will strengthen our hearts</u>!!!
- Expanding Your Horizons; Letting Go of the Familiar !!!
- Facing Suffering with *Dignity or Faith*...

Change!!! - <u>No body</u> likes change.....

- Some things *have taken a long time* to get them where they are.
- There was a certain *cost involved*.
- The way things are *is comfortable*.
- The way things are *is normal*.
- The way things are is *the way most people like it.*

"The World hates change, yet it is the only thing that has brought progress."

Most people *don't like change*. They are used to things *just like they are*.

What if how things are is not how God wants them to be?

- What if <u>He is not pleased</u> by what it is right now?
- What if it would please Him if some Change could happen?

<u>Matthew 5: 14-16</u> - <u>"You are the light of the world</u>. A town built on a hill cannot be hidden. ¹⁵ Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead, they put it on its stand, and <u>it gives light</u> to everyone in the house. ¹⁶ In the same way, <u>let your light shine</u> before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven.

Jesus compares His followers to light, saying "we are the light of the world," unable to be hidden. This reinforces the idea that our faith and actions should be visible and impactful, like a city that cannot be concealed.

If we live for Christ, we will glow like lights, showing others what Christ is like!

We <u>hide</u> our light by

- Being *quiet* when we should speak...
- **Going along with** the crowd...
- **Denying** the light...
- *Letting* sin dim our light...
- <u>Not</u> expanding our lights to others...
- *Ignoring* the needs of others...

Be a beacon of <u>truth</u> – <u>don't shut your light off</u> from the rest of the world...

In the absence of light darkness *prevails*. *Before* there was light there was *darkness*.

Gen.1 – *establishes the foundational truth that God*, the creator, brought fourth the heavens and the earth from a *"formless and empty"* state, <u>covering it with</u> <u>darkness</u>, and <u>then called forth light</u>, <u>separating it from darkness</u>, marking the beginning of the first day.

<u>Gen 1:1-5</u> NIV - The Beginning - 1 In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth.

²Now the earth was formless and empty, **darkness was over the surface of the deep**, and the Spirit of God was hovering over the waters.

³And God said, "Let there be light," and there was light.

⁴God saw that the light was good, and <u>he separated the light from the darkness</u>.

⁵God called the light "day," and the darkness he called "night." And there was evening, and there was morning—the first day.

You and I have <u>a choice</u> to make.

Are we going to <u>allow darkness to prevail</u> in our lives and in the lives of those around us???? Or are we going to <u>let His light shine</u>??? When darkness surrounds you, it is sometimes scary to pull out your light.

When I think of change, I think of the effect that light has in dark place.

A *place or condition* that is *dark and void,*

- **<u>Completely changes</u>** when <u>light</u> comes into the situation.
- Light has <u>courage</u>.
- It *doesn't* take much.
- Just a small flame can light up a deep and dark canyon that has never seen light.

The Light, God's truth and Life, shines even in the darkness of sin and ignorance, but the darkness cannot extinguish or overcome it!

John 1:5 NIV - The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.

It's interesting to me that *light has the ability to overcome darkness*, but that *darkness has no comprehension of the work that Light is doing*.

The rest of <u>the world</u> may not <u>comprehend or understand</u> the change that God is making in your life.

- They may say, "We liked it better when everything was dark."
- We liked you better *when you were a partier*.
- We liked you better when you told dirty jokes.
- We liked you better *when we could act the way we wanted* to around you.
- We liked it better <u>when there was darkness in your life</u>.

When I think of courage, I think of...

- William Tyndale Who in the early 1500's translated the Bible into English, <u>which at the time was forbidden</u> and punishable by execution. For his controversial views and belief that everyone should be able to read the Bible in their native tongue, he was later <u>arrested and executed</u>.
- Winston Churchill. When in 1940, Britain stood, alone against Nazi Germany. Some in Britain wanted to seek a deal with Hitler, <u>but Churchill</u> <u>wanted to fight on</u>, and <u>he inspired his country and the rest of the world</u> through their darkest hour.

- Rosa Parks who On December 1, 1955, in Montgomery, Alabama, <u>refused</u> <u>to obey</u> bus driver James F. Blake's order that she give up her seat in the colored section to a white passenger.
- <u>Her act of defiance</u> became an important <u>symbol of the modern Civil Rights</u> <u>Movement</u>.

She became an international icon of *resistance to racial segregation*.

- The Unknown Rebel at the 1989 Tiananmen Square Protests who faced off with the tanks of the People's Liberation Army on June 5. Stuart Franklin's famous photo of the stand-off went on to become one of Life's Magazine's *"100 Photos that Changed the World"* and *TIME listed the obscure and Unknown Rebel* as one of the 100 most influential people of the 20th century.
- Malala Yousafzai (1997) Pakistani schoolgirl <u>who defied threats of the</u> <u>Taliban</u> to campaign for the right to education. <u>She survived being shot in</u> <u>the head</u> by the Taliban and has become <u>a global advocate</u> for human rights, <u>women's rights</u> and <u>the right to education</u>.
- Jesus Christ who in spite of the shame suffered the death of the cross for you and for me.

The thing that limits so many people to a common, normal, ordinary life is fear.

- Fear of an *undesired outcome*
- Fear of other *people's opinion*
- Fear of *failure*

But to understand something, these are all natural fears.

- We <u>all</u> have these fears.
- The difference between <u>someone being fearful</u> and <u>someone being</u> <u>courageous</u>.....
- Is the fact that in the face of their fears,
- <u>They attempted and even accomplished</u> what they were afraid of!!!!

<u>Courage</u>.....

- It takes courage to stand up for what is right.
- It takes courage to make a difference.

It takes courage <u>to live a life that is pleasing to God</u> when <u>the rest of the world</u> <u>would condemn you f</u>or it.

Change <u>does not</u> come easy.

- Most people *do not like change*.
- Change exposes some things
- Change reveals some things
- Change means that what we had before was not enough.
- Change means something better has come.

Nicodemus visits Jesus at night

Jesus says to Nicodemus - <u>John 3:19-21</u> - This is the verdict: Light has come into the world, <u>but people loved darkness instead of light</u> because their deeds were evil.

²⁰ *Everyone <u>who does evil</u> hates the light* and <u>will not</u> come into the light <u>for fear</u> <u>that their deeds will be exposed.</u>

²¹ But <u>whoever lives by the truth comes into the light</u>, so that it may be seen plainly that what they have done has been done in the sight of God.

Many people don't want their lives exposed to God's light <u>because they are</u> <u>afraid of what may be revealed</u>.

- **People** who love their evil deeds avoid the light. (*They Don't want change*)
- Don't be surprised when the same people are threatened by your desire to obey God and do what is right...

They are afraid that the light in you may expose some of their darkness.

I found out the day I accepted Christ that *not everybody was going to understand my decision*.

- My friends *laughed at me*.
- My family *didn't believe in me*.
- My co-workers *mocked me*.

No one else in my entire circle went to church or lived for God at that time.

- I stood alone in a dark place.
- Just **my little light** and me.

But <u>change</u> was needed.

- Those who act in truth and righteousness seek the light!
- My life *couldn't continue in the direction it was going* in any longer.

I couldn't allow my soul to be destroyed by what was going on in my life.

<u>Change</u> had to happen!!! <u>Repentance had to happen</u>!!!!

- Regardless of what other people thought
- Regardless of how it would affect their thinking
- Regardless of *the family traditions*
- Regardless of *how they were brought up*
- Regardless of *who their God was* or *what their religion was*

<u>I needed</u> Change in my life!!!

My world was a dark place, and <u>I needed God to shine some light into my life.</u>

<u>It takes courage to say yes to God</u> when <u>everyone around you</u> is laughing and pointing their fingers.

- It takes courage to do what is right not only for yourself,
- But for the people you love even when they don't understand your actions.

People here today who will <u>make a decision to be saved</u> are heroes in my book.

- Some of them are *facing ridicule from their family and friends*.
- Some of them are facing <u>the generational curses</u> of their life and saying, "It stops here."
- It takes courage to step out of the crowd and say, "I want change".
- <u>It takes courage</u> to <u>admit</u> that you need His help!
- It takes courage to face your demons -
- And say *I choose Jesus Christ.*

It takes Courage to Change!!!

CLOSE: A courageous person *is not* absent of fear.

• But despite their fear, they do what they feel in their heart <u>needs to be</u> <u>done</u>.

It takes courage to be able to *look at your life from an outside perspective* and be able to say, "I am willing to change".

"Courage is doing what you are afraid to do. There can be no courage unless you are scared!"

Joshua is urged to *lead the Israelites into the Promised Land* with *unwavering faith and strength*, <u>knowing</u> God will be with him.

Joshua 1:9 - Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged, for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go."

This is a powerful message of <u>divine encouragement and assurance</u> of God's presence!

- It takes an incredible desire to decide that -
- You are no longer going to let life live you any longer - -
- That you are going to *stare it in the face and take it back*.

What does the Bible say about how to change:

Ephesians 4:20-24 - 20 That, however, is not the way of life you learned 21 when you heard about Christ and were taught in him in accordance with the truth that is in Jesus. 22 You were taught, with regard to your former way of life, to put off your old self, which is being corrupted by its deceitful desires; 23 to be made new in the attitude of your minds; 24 and to put on the new self, created to be like God in true righteousness and holiness.

• We must reflect a renewed mind and walk in Christ!

If you are tired of feeling worthless or not ok with life,

• Then it is *time to let go* and *step bravely ahead into a new life*.

Do not allow another day to go by <u>without knowing in your heart that you have</u> <u>made a decision</u> to do <u>what you know</u> God is asking you to do. >>>>>>>>>>Courage to change!!!!
